24 Hours for Our Lord


The "24 Hours for the Lord" event is a Lenten initiative of prayer and reconciliation introduced by Pope Francis. This year marks the 11th edition. As previously, the event will be celebrated in dioceses around the world on the eve of the fourth Sunday of Lent, from Friday, March 8th to Saturday, March 9th. The motto chosen by the Holy Father for this year is taken from a verse of the Letter to the Romans: "Walking in a new life" (Romans 6,4).

St. Raphael's Parish will hold Adoration of the blessed sacrament from the conclusion of Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 8th and will continue until 5:30 pm Saturday for Mass. There is a signup sheet to ensure that someone will be here during each hour of this blessed tradition. If you can commit to one hour of Adoration please sign up for an available time slot. Even if you can't commit to a full hour, come and spend time with The Lord.

Donations are now being accepted for **Easter Lily Memorials**. The cost will be \$15 per plant. If you plan to donate on WeShare the Easter Lily donation field should be active soon but please also fill out an envelope so that we properly receive your memorial intention.

Additional donations are also welcome to help cover the cost of other Easter Flowers and decorations. Envelopes are available in the entryway on the table.

Second Collection February 17th and 18th:

40 Cans of Lent

St. Raphael's "40 CANS FOR LENT" food drive runs through the Lenten season, Feb. 14 - March 28. This is the 11th year St. Raphael's KoC has sponsored 40 CANS, which benefits our local food bank, rescue mission, and any parishioners in need. The parish's generosity is the secret

ingredient that brings success every year in helping our community with hunger and inclusion.

The Fairbanks Food Bank deals with individual clients and benefits from "meals in a can" donations. Items like canned chili, soups, tuna... or individual mac and cheese servings are examples. Bags of apples, fruit, or nutrition bars are popular.

The Fairbanks Rescue Mission cooks for large groups and benefits from large, packaged item donations. They recently asked for 1-2 bags of onions, bottles of mayonnaise, boxes of instant potatoes, bags of pancake mix, spices, and baking ingredients including corn starch, onion powder, garlic powder, pepper, and Italian seasoning... are welcomed. Cases of canned vegetables are needed, especially green beans and corn.

All donated items are being collected in the parish social hall. An alternative way to contribute is to have the Knights shop for you. By making a monetary donation on WeShare, with cash or writing a check to St. Raphael Parish noting, **40 CANS** in the memo section of the check, the Knights will collect the funds and shop from the charitable organization's "what we need list" on your behalf.

If you're inclined to bake a few dozen cookies, homemade cookies are welcome at the Rescue Mission anytime!
