24 Hours for Our Lord


The "24 Hours for the Lord" event is a Lenten initiative of prayer and reconciliation introduced by Pope Francis. This year marks the 11th edition. As in previous years, the event will be celebrated in dioceses around the world on the eve of the fourth Sunday of Lent, from Friday, March 8th to Saturday, March 9th. The motto chosen by the Holy Father for this year is taken from a verse of the Letter to the Romans: "Walking in a new life" (Romans 6,4).

St. Raphael's Parish will hold Adoration of the blessed sacrament from the conclusion of Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 8th until 5:30 pm Saturday for Mass. There is a signup sheet to ensure that someone will be here during each hour of this blessed tradition. If you can commit to one or more hours of Adoration please sign up for available times. Even if you can't commit to a full hour, come and spend time with The Lord.

Donations are now being accepted for **Easter Lily Memorials**. The cost will be \$15 per plant. If you plan to donate on WeShare the Easter Lily donation field is active but please also fill out an envelope so that we properly receive your memorial intention.

Centering Prayer mini-workshop

The group will be using the work of Trappist Monk Fr Thomas Keating.

Fr Thomas is known for saying that this precious instrument is too good to remain locked in the cloister as it was in the past. He found a way where anyone can benefit from the rewards and blessings of this popular prayer method. The commitment and practice take one from not only meditating on the Passion and other events in the life of Christ but also assisting in finding a personal passion for developing a closer communion and relationship with Jesus Christ.
