Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Patience is rooted in Hope (an image of a bush filled with birds would be great)

Life, like the church, is often burdened with evil, smallness, and impurities. The Lord's parables give us a hope-filled perspective on all three.

Evil: in Jesus' parable about the good farmer whose enemy plants weeds at night, Jesus tells us that God is not the cause of evil but permits evil to exist with good out of his patient love. He will finally deal with it, but his love lets things stay messy for a time.

Smallness: It's funny that Jesus says his kingdom looks like ... wait for it ... a bush. What a letdown! Yet this little shrub still somehow has room for all the birds of the sky. The smallness of the Church, and even our own little lives, still provides plenty of room for all whom God sends.

Impurities: divisions and hypocrisies in the Church and our own hearts exasperate us. Recall that Jesus compares his kingdom to a lump of dough with impure leaven eating away at it and therefore making it expand. It's the secret of the Cross. Not how we'd prefer it. But finally, great news.

The field, the bush, the loaf: all three parables invite us to embrace a patience rooted in hope: one day the field will be weeded, the bush filled with birds, and the risen loaf leavenfree.

This week I challenge you to make the psalm refrain part of your spiritual DNA, "Lord, you are good and forgiving." Make these six words a part of every fiber of your being. Knit them into your bones. Let them take up residence in the deepest parts of your guts. They are the words that the Christian in the present age, must make their own. I used to believe that people don't go to confession, because they don't think that they sin. I don't believe this anymore. People don't ask for forgiveness of their sins, because they don't believe God has the power or desire to forgive them.

Jesus' message is simple, "Repent and believe the Good News." And the Good News, is that God desires reconciliation with His people. God desires his chosen people to return to full communion, and does absolutely everything possible to make this happen, everything except to force His people to receive His gifts. The Psalm refrain succinctly places this on our plate. God is Good, He doesn't coerce. God is forgiving, He desires reconciliation. "Lord, you are good and forgiving."



Stephen Ministry at St. Mary's Cathedral

The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need (Acts 6). Stephen Ministers are not counselors. They are trained Christian caregivers. Their role is to listen and care—not counsel or advise. Stephen Ministry is a supervised ministry. Stephen Ministers engage in twice-monthly supervision to ensure that they are providing the best-quality Christian care. Stephen Ministry is a confidential ministry. What a care receiver tells a Stephen Minister remains confidential. Even in supervision, the names of care receivers and specific details are never discussed. Stephen Ministers do not make cold calls. They are assigned only to people who agree to receive the care of a Stephen Minister — men with men and women with women.

If you or someone you know is going through a tough time, let a Stephen Minister walk with you. Fill out a request card and drop it in the prayer box in the Chapel or call (806) 350-2930 and leave a message. Someone will get back to you.
