Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

As a college student, my prized possession was an after-market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hardearned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love - Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you." Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chaffs us that God sets the terms of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus — but that doesn't make it easy.

St. Mary's Parish and School is excited to welcome Carolina Cantrell as the new Director of Development.

Amarillo native Carolina Cantrell holds a BS in Bible and English Literature from Dallas Christian College. She completed an internship in Tanzania, East Africa, focused on Bible translation from Swahili to the tribal language Kikami. Upon graduation, Cantrell served as an inner-city missionary for four years with World Impact in Dallas, Texas, working specifically to address the needs of women and children in poverty.

She then served as Assistant Director of Individual Giving at St. Mark's School of Texas in Dallas, securing alumni gifts during the silent phase of the \$112 million Centennial Challenge campaign. In 2009, Cantrell began working for her family business, Accent West Magazine, in Amarillo, Texas. Director of Development for Turn Center in Amarillo, the only non-profit in the Texas panhandle providing children physical, occupational, and speech therapy, from 2017-2022, raising more than \$5M in funding for capital and operating projects. Cantrell co-chaired the 2023 Downtown Women's Center Luncheon and Vintage Amarillo 2023, benefitting the Amarillo Symphony Guild.

Carolina has served as a volunteer director/advisor on several non-profit boards for organizations in the Texas Panhandle, including St. Mary's Cathedral School, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Amarillo Symphony Guild, Amarillo Museum of Art Alliance, and Women's Philanthropy Fund, administered by the Amarillo Area Foundation. She is a fourth-generation member of DAR and a third-generation member of PEO, Chapter Z.

Cantrell and her family are active parishioners at St. Mary's Cathedral. Her two youngest boys, John Asher (10) and Isaac (7) Walden, have been students at SMCS since they were three. "We all love St. Mary's so much. I am thrilled to have the opportunity to serve the parish and school in this capacity," said Cantrell of her new role as Director of Development. In Valencia, Spain, ninots and fallas are important symbols of Saint Joseph's Day. Ninots are figures made of papier-mâché and cardboard. They are carefully constructed and usually life-sized or larger. A group of *ninots* is assembled into a falla depicting a story or situation. It is usually filled with firecrackers and fireworks. Valencia has about 750 of these neighborhood falla groups. One is chosen by popular vote each year to be preserved in the regional museum. The rest are burnt during fireworks displays in the evening of March 19. The tradition of constructing and burning fallas arose at some stage in the Middle Ages. Carpenters burnt broken pieces of work and remnants of wood collected during the winter to celebrate the spring equinox. At some point, the fires

were moved to St Joseph's Day as he is the patron saint of carpenters. Many people wear traditional Valencian clothing on Saint Joseph's Day and display their clothing during parades. Some attend special church services to honor the life of St Joseph.

St Joseph's Day also celebrates fathers. Many people make a special effort to visit their father or father figures. Some people also take fathers or father figures to a restaurant or give Father's Day gifts.

United States Fasting and Abstinence Norms

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.
