BAPTISM INFORMATION – GODPARENTS

Dear Faithful Catholic:

Congratulations! If you are receiving this letter, you have been asked to represent the universal community of believers, the Church, to assist the parents of a child in raising them in the light of Christ Jesus as a godparent. Some people are surprised to learn that the requirements of the Church are stricter for godparents than for parents who desire that their child be baptized. While parents may not yet be at a place in their lives where their Christian living is as strong as it is hoped it will be, godparents serve to assure that a baptized child will have exemplars of Catholic living to help them and challenge them to be committed Christians as they grow up. Because a child cannot fully choose to belong to the household of God, strong parents, and especially strong godparents, serve as heroes and heroines of the Christian life which the formed and inspired child will choose as he/she matures., Please see the back of this letter to honestly consider whether or not you meet the expectations of a Catholic godparent and be honest with the parents who have chosen you. While not perfect, godparents should at least model a commitment and discipline of an actively practicing Catholic Christian. Blessings.

1. Members of St. Mary's Cathedral Parish should come to the Parish Office or find the Godparent request form on our website (stmarysamarillo.com), complete it and turn it in. See the reverse for godparent requirements.

- Membership at St. Mary's is affirmed by being recognizable by an up-to-date parish registration card, weekly attendance at Mass, and involvement in the parish by regular financial, time and talent contributions to the life of our community of faith.
- 3. Members of other parishes, whether in Amarillo or from out of town, must sign and then present the attached "Godparent Approval Form" to their parish pastor or his designee for their signature. These signed and sealed forms much be received at St. Mary's by mail or by drop in at least three weeks before the scheduled baptism.
- 4. Upon baptism preparation registration, please make an appointment at the Parish Office to receive instructions for baptism preparation by the Baptism Office.
- 5. You will watch the REBORN video concerning godparents: (Gift of Godparents)
 - A. Go to the website: formed.org
 - B. Use the St. Mary's parish code (6K26CJ) and create your own profile. See the insert about the opportunity to continue to learn on the FORMED website.
 - C. Click onto <STUDY>, <SACRAMENTAL PREP>, and then <REBORN>.
 - D. Watch "Gift of Godparents".
 - E. After the video, complete the related participant's pages in your book.
- Call for an appointment to bring your completed *Reborn* packet and signed approval letters to the Office of Baptism Preparation.
