# NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

## Make An Impact Through a Gift of Stock

St. Paul's always benefits when benefactors make cash gifts to the parish, but another tax-wise way to impact the parish is through gifts of appreciated stock held more than one year. A gift of stock benefits you as you pay no capital gains tax on the appreciated value of the stock. Additionally, if you itemize your tax return, the gift qualifies for a deduction equal to the stock's current value, even though no tax has been paid on the appreciation. The gift of stock must be a direct transfer to the Archdiocese' Catholic Community Foundation, where you can instruct the gift to specifically benefit St. Paul's. If you want to consider a gift of appreciated stock, you may want to explore this option with your tax advisor. 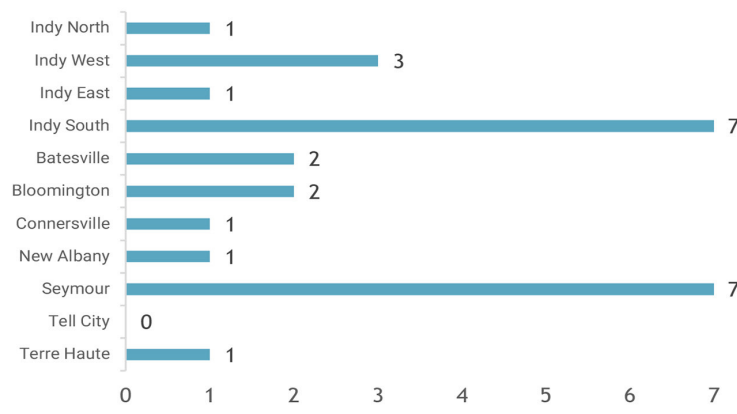
