## **Priest's Corner**

Dear Friends,

My name is Fr. Simon Felix Michalski, O.P. I am returning to St. Paul's after a six and half year tour of duty in other parts of our Province. It is great to be back, and I am looking forward to serving here, and contributing to the mission here in Bloomington and beyond.

I would like to tell you a little bit about my journey, my interests, and my hopes.

I went to college at Eastern Michigan University. I have always wanted to be a college professor. I was a perpetual college student because I changed my major three times. I studied Classical History, Speech and Language Pathology, and Linguistics.

I also dropped out of college to work, and also had to work full time during the last leg of my undergraduate education. Because of all these factors, my undergraduate degree took ten years.

I then earned a Masters at Marygrove College in Detroit. I received a master's in Pastoral Ministry because I thought I would be a Theology Professor.

I received the call from God at 10 years old. I ran and ran from God for over twenty years. I was a late vocation. I entered the Order at 37 years old. I spent one year in Colorado at our novitiate, and I loved it. It felt to me that I was finally coming home and I had been on vacation my whole life.

I lived in St. Louis during my studies, and also served in Wisconsin, Chicago and Mexico. I earned another Masters from our school in St. Louis, the Aquinas Institute of Theology.

I was ordained in 2008. I have had six assignments: Columbia MO--Bloomington IN—Madison WI—St. Louis MO—River Forest IL—Bloomington IN. I have served as Associate Pastor, Prior, Pastor, and Superior. I have loved my life as a Dominican Friar and I have had wonderful experiences.

I call myself an ABCDE Catholic. A is for the angels, for I like to promote their relationship to us and their help in our ministry. B is for Byzantine, for I love Icons and Incense. C is for Charismatic for I am very keen on promoting the Holy Spirit and a life of virtue. D is for Dominican spirituality and the active/contemplative life. E is for Evangelization, which is the purpose of the Church.

I look forward to our time together in service to the Lord. My hope is that I serve this parish well.



#### LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. Are we ready to listen and be challenged and stretched?



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
