“He was hungry.” After Jesus had fasted for forty days in the desert, as the Gospel tells us, he was hungry. We want to say, well duh! Of course he was hungry after fasting for that long! And yet, Jesus’s hunger goes right to the heart of the mystery of the Incarnation. The Son of God, with the Father from eternity, needing nothing, came to share in our hunger. He came to share in our need and insufficiency. The painting below, by Russian artist Ivan Kramskoi, always brings the mystery of Jesus’s hunger home for me. He looks like a poor and lonely man, an outcast and a beggar. And yet somewhere out there the Devil senses the hateful (to him) presence of absolute Holiness; he senses that his sway over the world must come to an end in this Presence. With all the need and hunger that we feel, and that we see in the world around us, let us remember this Lent that Jesus went there with us and for us, and may we tap into the strength Jesus gets from his Father.

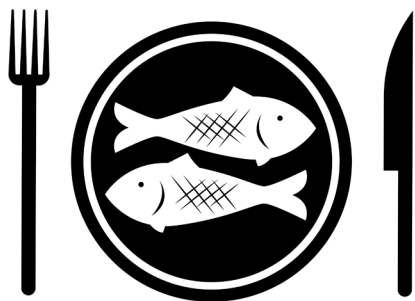

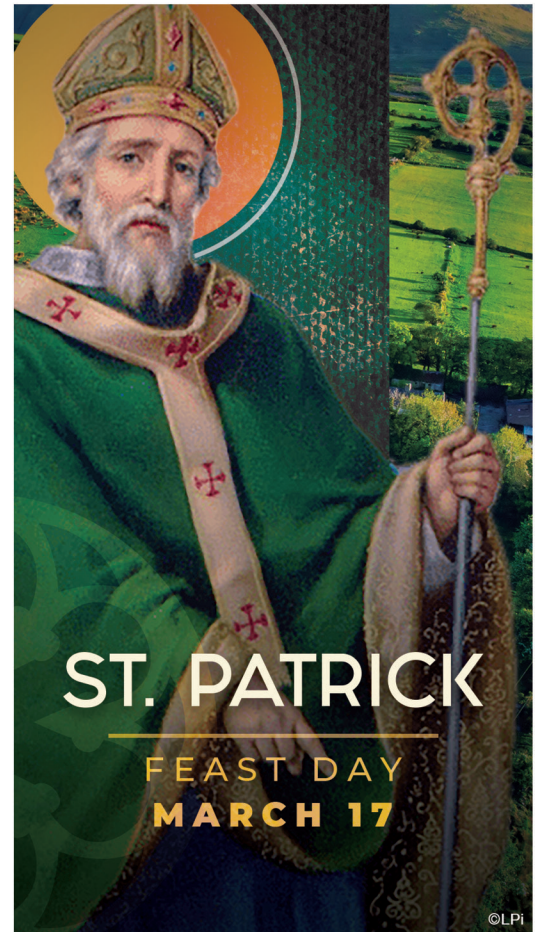

Inspiration for the week

While we have to be cognizant of our societal and personal responsibilities in this world, we can never lose sight of where our true citizenship lies — heaven. When we become too immersed in earthly things and too preoccupied with our temporal responsibilities, we can actually become numb to our faith. Becoming ambivalent about our faith, our belief in Jesus Christ and the promises of heaven become more a source of agitation rather than a source of promise and hope. It is easy to become an enemy of Christ without even knowing it is happening. God has given us a very clear destiny. We are definitely not meant to conform ourselves to this world but to the transfiguration and glorification of our bodies to come. It is here where we can see clearly not only who God is but who we are. The way many conduct the daily business of their lives suggests that such a promise or hope is of little importance. What does the way you live your daily life say about you?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.
