Letter from a Priest

A Spiritual Plan for this Year

Dear friends,

I am writing today to encourage you to reflect on your prayer life from last year, and as we begin a new year with Christ, to make a plan to draw closer to Jesus this year. May this year be the closest year of your life with Jesus. He is a suggested way to go about this task:

1. Begin in prayer

Come Holy Spirit, come as you will. Teach me about my life and how to draw closer to you this year, Advent 2022 to Advent 2023. Fill me with your light, love, and truth as I reflect on my past year with Jesus.

- 2. Spend some to reflecting on your life of prayer and service
 - a. What are my strongest spiritual practices? Where am I weak? What are the opportunities around me for spiritual growth? How is the devil tempting me? What is my primary fault? Where am I wounded?
 - b. Can I...go to Mass more? Go to confession more? Say the rosary more? Read the Bible More?
 - c. What are my practices of self-denial? Fasting? And Alms giving? Do I do penance?
 - d. Do I have a balance in the kinds of prayer? Do I pray vocal prayer? Do I pray mental prayer? Do I pray contemplative prayer?
 - e. Do I have a theme to pray and study about this year? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal one to you.
 - f. Do I have Spiritual reading as part of my life?
 - g. Which of the corporal works of mercy do I try to do? Is there a way to begin doing one of them on a regular basis?
- 3. Write down your goals for this year and review them once per week.
- 4. Thanks God for His Mercy and Loving Kindness toward you
- 5. Ask for the intercession of Mary and your favorite saint.

I will reveal to you my new goals for the year. (I am still working on them, though).

- a. My strengths in my spiritual life are Vocal and Mental Prayer. I would like to strengthen my practice of contemplative prayer.
- b. I am committed to Mass every day, Rosary every day, and reading a book of the Bible each season. I will be reading the Book of Revelation for the Advent/Christmas season.
- c. I will have a penance practice once per week, and before each Mass. (increasing it during Lent)
- d. My theme for the year is to learn more about St. Paul.
- e. I will continue to practice the corporal works of Mercy, especially Intercession Prayer for 5 minutes a day.

That is my plan for the year. I hope you can share yours with me, or someone else in your life, so that we can keep each other accountable.

Remember we are trying to achieve a balance between Prayer, Study, Community, Ministry, and self care. Enjoy the planning process.

Here are some list that may be helpful in your planning:

Corporal works of Mercy: Feed the Hungry, Give drink to the Thirsty, Shelter the Homeless, Clothe the Naked, Visit the Sick, Visit those in Prison, Burry the Dead, and Pray for the Living and the Dead

Essential Prayer Practices: The Holy Mass, Confession, Rosary, Lectio Divina, Contemplative Prayer, Reading the Lives of the Saints, Study, Bible, and a Holy Hour.



St. Andrew Feast day: November 30

Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew. Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.
