Letter from a Priest

Ordinary Time Spiritual Practices Too!

I like to think about ordinary time as the school of the Holy Spirit. During ordinary time we will have readings which teach about being a Missionary Disciple of Christ. This means, you are a follower of Jesus who has a deep spiritual life and who is engaged in Evangelizing. In other words, an ordinary life of a Catholic Christian.

It seems to me that just as during Lent and Advent, one takes on spiritual practices that are related to that season, one should also take on spiritual practices for ordinary time as well. If one uses the same paradigm which we use for Lent, we can readily shift the focus of the practices to match each season. The paradigm is prayer, fasting, alms giving, and self-denial.

Prayers during Ordinary time should be focused on growing one's relationship with God, and on studying the faith in order to be better able to help other people find a deeper relationship with God. Prayer should include devotional prayers, mental prayer, and times of silence, (contemplative prayer). I highly recommend that each season of the Church year one should pick a book from the New Testament and read and reread it in order to get a better understanding of the stories in the Bible. This season I am reading and re-reading the Book of Acts, chapter 17 to Chapter 28.

Fasting during Ordinary time should be done once per week. The Catholic fast is usually two small meals and one regular sized meal, with no snacking. Most people fast on Wednesday or Friday. I will try and fast on Thursday's this season. (Don't forget to fast before Mass)

Alms giving has to do with the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. One should be looking for ways to serve others, and ways to forgive, teach, admonish, comfort, etc. These works of mercy also include hospitality, Social Justice, and Evangelization. Dorothy Day once said that if your life does not touch on the Works of Mercy each week, then you are missing the true meaning of the Gospel. I will be focusing on Evangelization this season of Ordinary Time.

Self-Denial is a practice of making small sacrifices for God. It is a matter of picking something you like and giving it up for one day a week. I am trying to give up my morning coffee on Wednesdays this season.

In addition to these practices I also want to remind you of your Spiritual Survival Kit. These are the practices that help us to not only survive, but thrive. There are 5 in my kit. The Holy Mass and Holy Confession, the Holy Rosary, Holy Scripture, and Spiritual Reading. I recommend that if you do not go to daily Mass, try and go one extra time per week. I further recommend that you go to confession in each season of the year. I also recommend that you use the rosary for mental prayer, and every third book or so, read the life of a saint. (We have a library downstairs filled with good books).

This year, we as a Church are reading the Gospel of St. Matthew. Keep that in your mix too.

Broken Front Doors Update

We are currently working toward a solution for the main doors to the Gathering Space. We apologize for the continued inconvenience.

At present, the hardware on the door is broken beyond repair. Estimates to have the doors replaced are more than \$12,000. This is because the entire system of frames and doors would need to be replaced. Tim Mercer is working to identify if and how a less expensive, but only temporary, solution can be made.

Unfortunately, issues like this in the Church and Gathering Space are going to continue to come up as almost everything in both is nearly 30 years old and is at or well beyond its life expectancy. We hope to address these issues with the next phase of our master plan, but, in the meantime, we will need to cobble together solutions as problems arise.
