Letter from music ministry

I wanted to take this opportunity of writing a note to you in the bulletin to invite you to become a part of the music ministry at St. Paul Catholic Center. Many of you have both talent and experience with choral singing, soloing, or playing an instrument, but are reluctant to commit to the music ministry due to your schedule or sheer unpredictable busyness. However, those of you who have decided to try singing in the choir have found it to be therapeutic for your hectic lives. It has become, as so many have told me, the one moment of peace and respite in the week. That's what music does. It becomes a salve to heal and restore. How much more so when the music we make is meant to glorify the Lord and enrich his people's worship in the Mass?! Indeed, my approach to music ministry is first and foremost about bringing glory to God.

Secondly, we exist to edify his people, including those of us in the choir family, and to facilitate the people's worship. Only then does the music enter into the scene, flowing in and around our ministry. Many of you have expressed that you doubt your ability to contribute meaningfully, indicating that your talent doesn't match those of us in the choir. My response to that is: you won't know that for sure until you try. Our choirs are not auditioned groups. Yes, of course musical experience is helpful, but not necessarily required. Give it a shot. You might be glad you did.

Below I will give you the pertinent information regarding the various opportunities you have to lend your talents to the music ministry at St. Paul's. But before I do, allow me to suggest that Lent is coming.

Ash Wednesday is February 22nd this year. Perhaps a good Lenten discipline – a sacrifice you could make for the Lord, or a way of cultivating the talents he graciously gave to you – would be to commit to singing or playing in our music ministry... just for the season. All I ask is that you pray about it.

Broken Front Doors Update

We are currently working toward a solution for the main doors to the Gathering Space. We apologize for the continued inconvenience.

At present, the hardware on the door is broken beyond repair. Estimates to have the doors replaced are more than \$12,000. This is because the entire system of frames and doors would need to be replaced. Tim Mercer is working to identify if and how a less expensive, but only temporary, solution can be made.

Unfortunately, issues like this in the Church and Gathering Space are going to continue to come up as almost everything in both is nearly 30 years old and is at or well beyond its life expectancy. We hope to address these issues with the next phase of our master plan, but, in the meantime, we will need to cobble together solutions as problems arise.

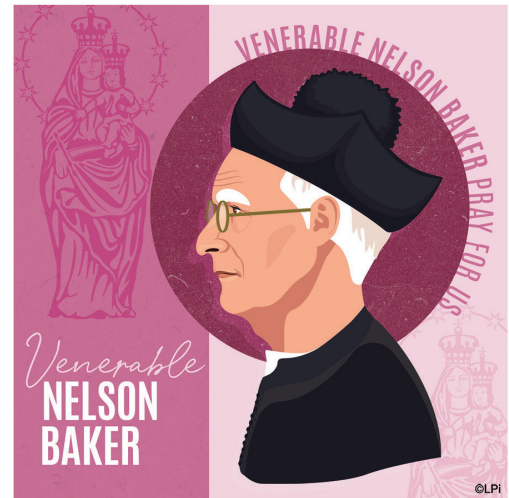
