Letter from

Dear Parishioners,

When you read this, I will be out of the country. You may recall that last year I accompanied our FOCUS missionaries and several of our students on a mission trip to Lima, Peru. This year Fr. Reginald is accompanying a trip to Costa Rica (much to the joy of the large Tico population at the 12:30 Mass). I was not supposed to go anywhere, but a couple weeks ago I got a call from a missionary who served here as an intern last year. She and 4 other missionaries are leading a trip to the Dominican Republic and the chaplain they had lined up backed out at the last minute. I left Friday morning for Miami and we arrived in Santo Domingo on Saturday afternoon. What I know about the trip is that we will be spending the week working with an organization that builds pumps and filters, ensuring the community has potable water.

There is a lot I can write about, but there is also a lot of unknown related to this trip. None of the other missionaries have been on a mission trip through FOCUS, so I am the one who seems to be asking necessary questions. For example, during a phone call I had with the team director last week I asked about our accommodations. She responded, "Great question. I need to look into that." I do know that we are staying in a hotel near the airport in Miami!

While there are a lot of unknowns related to this trip (the same was true in Lima), one thing I do know is that the community where we will be working has approximately 17 families as residents. They generally get a priest about one Sunday a month for Mass. I will be there working in this community for 6 days, and will be able to say Mass in their native language each of those days. None of us know if they have had such an opportunity, something that we take for granted. I have been a priest for nearly 26 years and have celebrated the Eucharist in many different situations.

However, I have never been to a place that sees a priest only once a month, if that. I think about our missionary Dominicans, such as Bishop Fenwick and Fr. Mazzuchelli (both of whom basically founded the church and the Order in the Midwest) who rode horses for miles and celebrated the Eucharist for communities who may have gone a year or so without the sacraments. This is certainly something to think about. I do not know how I will be received in this community, but I am looking forward to celebrating at least the Eucharist daily for a community that does not have regular access to it.

We take access to the sacraments for granted. For example, we have several hours scheduled for Confession every week. Students, residents, and members of the larger community are aware of this and know we will be there! During the rare times we must cancel Confessions, people understand that there will always be another opportunity, perhaps that day. One fact is: there are communities around the world – even in the Americas – that do not have regular access to the sacraments. However, that does not lessen the need for Christ.

Blessed Lent to you all!
