A Note from Emma Schuler

They are new every morning

Lamentations 3:22-23 says,

"The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases,
His mercies never come to an end;
They are new every morning;
Great is your faithfulness."

These two verses have been ringing in my ears the last few weeks. They are especially powerful and profound because of where in Scripture they are found. You see, the book of Lamentations is a funeral lament over the lost city of Jerusalem and the destruction of the temple. In losing the temple, the Jewish people have lost the very presence of God. The poet behind the lament describes himself as "a man who has seen affliction" (3:1). The verses right before what I have quoted above say this:

"My soul is bereft of peace,
I have forgotten what happiness is;
So I say, 'Gone is my glory,
And my expectation from the LORD'" (3:17-18)

You can imagine the despair and the desolation. Alone and exiled, the poet recognizes his anguish, but he never loses his hope. He remembers hope for himself and for his people when he reminds us: "The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases... They are new every morning."

Friends, this year is the Jubilee Year of Hope. Before his death, Pope Francis set before us the call to spend this year as Pilgrims of Hope, seeking God's mercy and living a life of hope in His fidelity. Have you strived to be a Pilgrim of Hope this year? Do you allow your lamentations to be consoled with the memory of God's steadfast love? In this, the Jubilee Year of Hope, let us call to mind the Truth that God's mercies are new every morning. God's love is not stale. God's Love is His very Self. Freely given to you in every moment of every day. Always present. Always new.

My prayer this summer is for an increase in hope for myself, and for all of us here at St. Paul's. Maybe your current season of life is feeling a lot like the first two chapters of the Book of Lamentations. Maybe you're in a more cheerful season. Maybe you're somewhere in between. No matter what may be, the Truth remains: Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. What have we to fear? Let us cast aside our worry and transform our lives as Pilgrims of Hope!

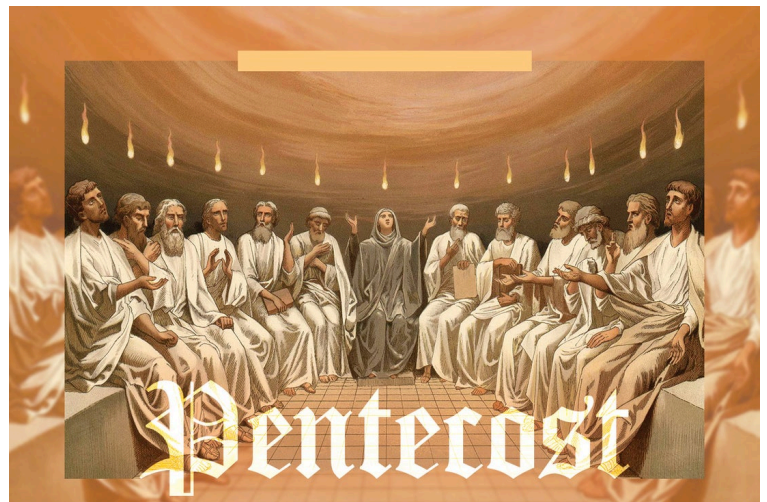
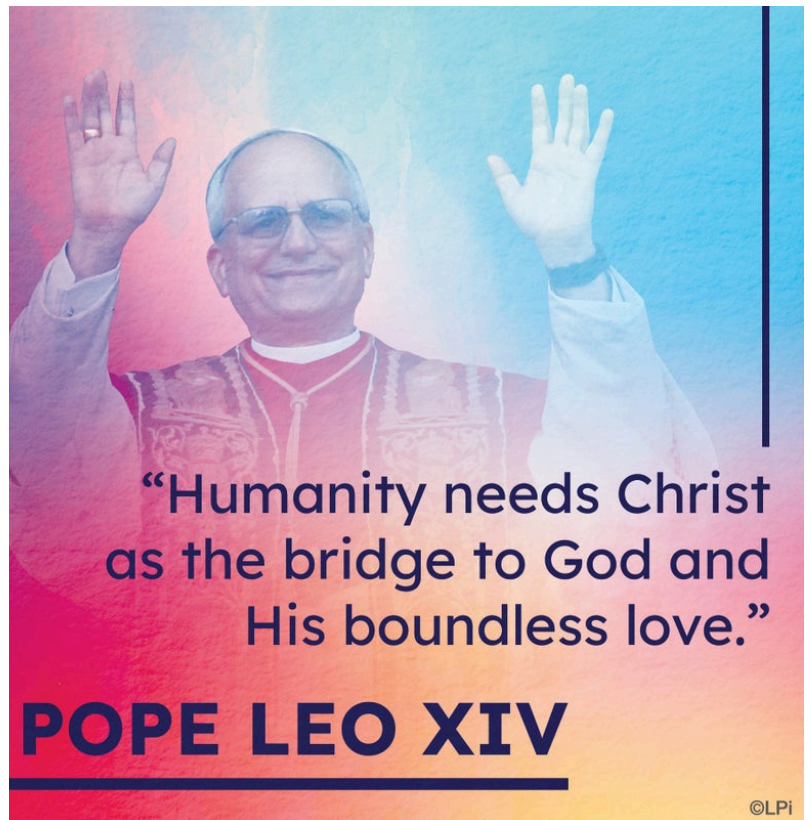


Our Mission

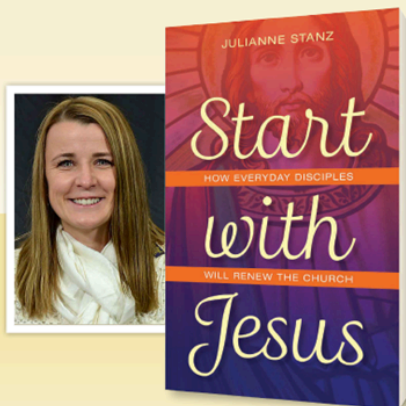
