

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday. Its particular focus is to highlight the enduring importance of Jesus' command to go out into all the world and proclaim the Good News. This is not just the mission of mission-aries and ordained ministers, but the mission of each baptized person sharing the priestly, prophetic, and kingly aspects of Christ. Jesus was anointed by the Father to bring salvation to the world throughout time. Each person anointed in Jesus' name shares in Christ's mission from the Father to bring light into darkness, hope where there is despair, love converting hatred, new life from what is feared dead. Impossible relying on human strength and understanding alone, but with God, all things are possible.

Today's readings describe the omnipotence of God. God's power and authority working through and around human kings like Cyrus and Caesar. Isaiah prophecies that through Cyrus God is working to vindicate God's people to glory in a new Jerusalem. There is never a time God is not present to God's chosen ones even though it may seem God is distant or has forgotten. Time and time again Jesus reminded the apostles and all disciples following his preaching that God is always at work in the world. That is why Jesus replies to Pilate that he would have no power unless it was given to him by the Father. Whether Pilate understood or believed Jesus was irrelevant. Cyrus, Caesar, Pilate, all had pertinent parts to play as Jesus centrally did in God's unfolding plan of salvation. The gospel ultimately spreads by faith from one believer to the next. The apostles went out from Jerusalem through villages, towns, and cities proclaiming the Good News and baptizing all who believed. It is remarkable in the Acts of the Apostles to read one day 3,000 were added and another day 5,000. It is just as remarkable to read our baptismal register each year and see 40 one year and 45 the next. I have not counted all the names from 1966 to today but I would guess it is somewhere in the thousands as well. Generation to generation throughout the world the gospel continues to spread.

The Propagation of the Faith is the universal Church's office in Rome that supports missionaries throughout the world spreading the gospel message today. It is through the support of parishioners like you in parishes throughout the world that the Propagation of the Faith has resources to fund missionaries continuing to spread the gospel in lands where Christianity is not as known or accepted as in Easton, Massachusetts. I am grateful for others with a more adventurous missionary spirit than I have. You have heard from many Holy Cross Missionaries throughout the years speaking from experiences in the jungle villages of East Africa, the crowded streets of Bangladesh and India, to the high plateau parishes of Peru. I admire their willing spirit to go where the Spirit leads. I am grateful the Spirit has led me to serve within the continental United States!

Nonetheless, from Jerusalem to Rome, Antioch to Easton, every baptized Christian has a pertinent and purposeful part to play in Jesus' mission of making God known, loved, and served. Let us each do what we can in word and deed each day to follow Jesus' command to spread the Good News. It doesn't always mean traveling to the ends of the earth but living the gospel message of love, mercy, forgiveness, hope and joy among other things does mean responding to God's invitation in some tangible way. Each time we hear "the Mass is ended, go in peace," let us also hear "Go out into the whole world and spread the Good News."



From the Health Ministry and Parish Nurses:

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, here are some things you should know:



Any change in the size or the shape of the breast.

Pain in any area of the breast.

Nipple discharge other than breast milk (including blood).

A new lump in the breast or underarm

If you have any signs that worry you, see your doctor right away.

Check with your Dr. on when you should get a mammogram as the recommendations are different then in the past. Do breast self-exams.

Risk factors include:

Being a woman

Being older. Most breast cancers are found in women who are 50 years old or older

Having changes in your BRCA1 or BRCA2 gene To lower your breast cancer risk.

Keep a healthy weight and exercise regularly Don't drink alcohol or limit the amount of alcohol you drink.

If you are taking hormone replacement therapy or birth control pills, ask your doctor about the risks. Breastfeed your children, if possible.

Reading 1

IS 45:1, 4-6

Thus says the LORD to his anointed, Cyrus, whose right hand I grasp, subduing nations before him, and making kings run in his service, opening doors before him and leaving the gates unbarred: For the sake of Jacob, my servant, of Israel, my chosen one, I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not. I am the LORD and there is no other, there is no God besides me. It is I who arm you, though you know me not, so that toward the rising and the setting of the sun people may know that there is none besides me. I am the LORD, there is no other.

Reading 2

1 THES 1:1-5B

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: grace to you and peace.

We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers, unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ, before our God and Father, knowing, brothers and sisters loved by God, how you were chosen.

For our gospel did not come to you in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction.

M 22:15-21

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax." Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar

and to God what belongs to God."
