

Dear Parishioners,

This 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus sends out the disciples two-by-two to spread the Good News and to do miraculous things through Jesus' name. Doing so takes great trust and a leap of faith in Jesus now as it did then. We are all blest in Christ, chosen by God and sealed in his Spirit to do the best we can in what we say and do to spread God's life and love to any and all whom we meet. I chuckle inside every time I hear someone say, "My faith is private, it is between God and me." This is not what Jesus taught and did. Jesus drew people out of themselves and into community with others precisely so that God is made known, loved, and served by those who believe and respond because of their faith. Yes, there is the Gospel from Matthew we hear on Ash Wednesday that speaks about praying to God in the secrecy of one's own room however that is read in the context of introspection during the Season of Lent. Most other scriptures are like the ones we hear today, calling us to go out into the world and to teach others to pray with us. Human beings are so-cial creatures by nature. We are created to interact as the Holy Trinity interacts with each other and to share our love and life with the world as God shares God's life and love with each person and all peoples through our sacramental celebrations and simply living happy and holy lives with each other.

We welcome Fr. John Santone, C.S.C. back to Holy Cross Parish after a twenty-year journey serving others in different places. He will share more about himself and where he has been in next week's bulletin, and as he begins sharing the Good News and reflecting upon it in homilies here as well. Fr. John and I have known each other since we both began in the Congregation of Holy Cross in 1993, he as a candidate/postulant and me as a sophomore undergraduate seminarian. Our brotherhood and friendship have grown over the years and we both were very excited when the possibility of working and living together started becoming a reality for this summer. We are both back living in the rectory as well since he comes this time with his dog Watson. All three of us managed to get from Holy Cross Parish in South Bend, Indiana (where Fr. Jim Fenstermaker became pastor after leaving here – it was great to see him for a few days) to Holy Cross Parish in Easton, Massachusetts this week. Please keep us in your prayers as we keep all of you in our communal and individual prayers.

The 80th Annual Catholic Appeal serving the needs of the Diocese of Fall River's many important outreach ministries ended on June 30th. Your generosity to this year's "Time to Gather, Time to Heal, Time to Love" appeal is humbling. Our parish goal was \$37,149, and parishioners and a few others gave or pledged \$38,875 (105% of goal). Amazing teamwork supporting our brothers and sisters in need throughout the Diocese. Thank you for your donations and generous hearts.

Summer has definitely begun after the heat wave at the beginning of the month and now that the 4th of July has come and gone. I hope these summer days find you able to slow your pace back down after returning to work post-covid and schools being on summer break. I am grateful to have spent time relaxing in our back-yard pool at my Mom's house and visiting family while back in South Bend. However, we never hopefully take a vacation from God. 

THE CONFITEOR

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

READING I Am 7:12-15

Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Off with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah! There earn your bread by prophesying, but never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple." Amos answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

READING II Eph 1:3-14 or 1:3-10

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of God's grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

GOSPEL Mk 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


The Family Walk is back! Saturday August 7, 2021



Inspiration for the week

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.




