FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Autumn! The fall season is underway since this past Wednesday. The energy and enthusiasm of a new school year is underway at Holy Cross even though the trees and other plants are beginning to die back as winter approaches. Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW) and Children's Choir both began last weekend. Faith Formation classes begin this weekend. It is even more joyous because children and families are back in church and the parish center after two school years interrupted and severely truncated as we weathered the worst of the covid pandemic. Children and catechists will have to wear masks while together as students and teachers do in their respective schools. It still is strongly recommended we all do while together at Mass, but it is no longer mandated in church. I am grateful we can gather for prayer and passing on the faith in person rather than another year of solitary streaming and zoom even with these continued protocol for masks.

The primary place the faith is passed on and nourished is in the communal celebration of the Eucharist. Hearing and reflecting upon God's word and being nourished by Jesus receiving his very real Body and Blood, fully present in both the host and chalice, are the strongest expressions of God's real presence in our lives today as when Jesus walked amid the crowds with his apostles. In presenting children for baptism, parents agree to being the first and best teachers of the faith to their children. It is a simple question and answer during baptism but can be a very profound and life changing commission for them, their children, and the entire family if they live into this promise. Full, active, and conscious participation at Sunday and Holyday Masses is expected of all Catholics from baptism on. I do not say this to make anyone feel overly guilty, but to reaffirm our understanding and belief that the Eucharist is the center of our lives as followers of Jesus Christ, and that we seek to keep God's commandment of remembering to keep the Lord's Day holy. A small weekly sacrifice to make and offer to God knowing that we freely give over our time, talents, and treasure to many other passing things of this life. Our faith, hope, and love are the only things that remain into eternal life.

Fr. John and I look forward to visiting classrooms while the other is offering the 10:00am Mass in church. We both know from experience how beneficial it is for the students, who are the future of the Church, to get to know the priests. My vocation ultimately sprung from learning from my parents and catechists at St. Patrick and St. John the Baptist parishes in South Bend, Indiana. It was also nourished beyond the Sunday morning classroom by grace before family meals at home and at my grandparents, aunts, and uncles' homes. I learned how to pray the rosary at family wakes and at church on Wednesday evenings with Grandma and Grandpa Metz during the Living Rosary. I was really nervous to stand when it was my turn and recite a Hail Mary, Glory Be, or Our Father in front of a lot of people in church, but then I got to remain standing and hold a battery-operated lit rose added to those of parishioners before and after me, until the church lights were turned off at the end and the entire church was lit by our roses held high to Mary as we all sang *Immaculate Mary*. I have to laugh now as a pastor and 21st century citizen thinking how many batteries we must have gone through in a year, and they were not recycled back then. Little did my grandparents and parents know or maybe realize that what they were doing would help this future priest pray with other families leading wakes and Masses. If they never planted and tended the seeds of faith within me, I likely wouldn't be here today serving and teaching you and your family. I will ever be grateful for their simple faith lived out through example week in and week out. I know Fr. John feels the same about his grandparents and family.

In this ongoing Year of St. Joseph, let us entrust this new school year to Jesus' earthly parents and grandparents: Mary and Joseph, Ann and Joachim, knowing that God our Father and Jesus his Son watch over all of us in heaven and on earth through their Holy Spirit ever present and always guiding us if we open our hearts and follow God's call in our lives each day. We still need a few catechists. Anyone confirmed can help pass on the faith. Don't forget you will always know more than most of the children and teens (there are a few that keep us on our toes and running for the Catechism!). Very often the catechists say they continue learning right along with the kids. You won't regret it, and will feel much better about your parish and the Church next summer when you know you did your part in building up the Kingdom of God on earth and making saints for heaven. Reflection



26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"WE ARE EACH OF US LIKE A SMALL MIRROR IN WHICH GOD SEARCHES FOR HIS REFLECTION."

ST. JOHN VIANNEY

READING I Nm 11:25-29

The LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to Moses. Taking some of the spirit that was on Moses, the LORD bestowed it on the seventy elders; and as the spirit came to rest on them, they prophesied. Now two men, one named Eldad and the other Medad, were not in the gathering but had been left in the camp. They too had been on the list, but had not gone out to the tent; yet the spirit came to rest on them also, and they prophesied in the camp. So, when a young man quickly told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp," Joshua, son of Nun, who from his youth had been Moses' aide, said, "Moses, my lord, stop them." But Moses answered him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the LORD were prophets! Would that the LORD might bestow his spirit on them all!"

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 19:8, 10, 12-13, 14

R. (9a) The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart.

READING II Jas 5:1-6

Come now, you rich, weep and wail over your impending miseries. Your wealth has rotted away, your clothes have become moth-eaten, your gold and silver have corroded, and that corrosion will be a testimony against you; it will devour your flesh like a fire. You have stored up treasure for the last days. Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers who harvested your fields are crying aloud; and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. You have lived on earth in luxury and pleasure; you have fattened your hearts for the day of slaughter. You have condemned; you have murdered the righteous one; he offers you no resistance.

GOSPEL Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
