

Dear Parishioners.

Memorial Day Weekend, the unofficial start to the summer season (officially June 20th), and last weekend's high temperatures felt like it! It is a holiday weekend, an extended time to relax, but let us never forget why we have this extra day off on Monday. It is "Decoration Day," a time to visit the graves and remember and give thanks for the millions of American men and women of all colors and ancestral ethnicities, sexual orientations, and ages, who served this country and made the ultimate sacrifice defending our life, liberties, and pursuits of happiness. I am always moved by the thousands of flags on the Boston Common and the many waving silently at Immaculate Conception Cemetery, Furnace Village, Southeast, Melrose, Calvary, and countless other places where our dead are buried, where we pause, we mourn, and we give thanks. I am humbled at so many veteran's funerals when taps echoes through the air while families and friends softly put



a hand over their hearts and feel tears well up within recalling the gratitude we all share for their loved one's devotion and dedication. Relax and celebrate this weekend, but also remember to pause and give thanks. We will have our regular 9:00am Mass on Monday in church to pray for our fallen heroes and their families.

On Thursday we welcome one of our over fifty Holy Cross seminarians and religious brothers, Alex White, CSC, who will join us for his summer ministry placement from June 2nd through the first week of August before returning to Moreau Seminary at Notre Dame, Indiana to continue his formation and studies on the way to becoming a Holy Cross priest. He will minister here but live amid three additional seminarians with our CSC Community at Stonehill. Aaron is working on the Farm at Stonehill and Jack and Liam will be at My Brother's Keeper. I'll get the other three over here sometime over the summer. I asked Alex to share with us a bit about himself. He will be around Masses next weekend.

"Peace in Christ to everyone at Holy Cross Parish in Easton! My name is Alex White, C.S.C. I'm the fourth of five children hailing from Fayetteville, West Virginia (the coolest small town in the U.S). I encountered Holy Cross as an undergraduate at the University of Notre Dame, and I entered seminary following my time teaching high school theology in Indianapolis through the Notre Dame Echo program. While in college, I studied theology and Italian. *Mi piace il gelato*. I'm finishing my second year of temporary vows. Unless God invites me elsewhere, I'll be ordained a deacon in the fall of 2024 and a priest in the spring of 2025.

I really look forward to being in New England, especially ministering among the poor. I've helped out at Andre House in Phoenix, AZ, St. Andre Bessette Parish in Portland, OR, and Our Lady of the Road in South Bend, IN. I've also helped with youth and young adult ministry at St. Ignatius Martyr Parish in Austin, TX, so I'm eager to help out. Some of my hobbies include playing sports, doing improv comedy, playing the piano, and playing board games. I wouldn't say no to throwing a frisbee along the shores of the Cape if you twisted my arm!

It will be all grace to meet you all this summer. Please pray for me! I promise to do the same for you. See you soon!"

Fr. John shared that his last weekend at this Holy Cross Parish will be the last weekend of next month, June 25th & 26th before his car points west the morning of Tuesday, June 28th as he and Watson head back to Indiana to take up residence again with Fr. Jim Fenstermaker, C.S.C. at Holy Cross Parish in South Bend, Indiana and Fr. John returns to the classroom teaching canon law at Notre Dame in the fall. We will have a *Bon voyage* social (figured with our Community's French roots and all) after the 10:00am Mass on the 26th in the great room to wish him well.

Lastly, we are heading into the last week of Paying-Off-the-Debt 2022. We have \$10,000 to go to reach our \$180,000 goal to be debt free! 


St. Charles Lwanga & Companions 03 June

Charles Lwanga was a page in the royal court of King Mwanga. He along with twenty-two other martyrs suffered greatly while remaining staunch in their faith. Among the martyrs were pages, judges, a catechist, and a chief.

In their Mass of Canonization on 18 October 1964, Pope Paul VI referred to them as Africa's gifts to the Church and said: "These African martyrs herald the dawn of a new age ... Africa has been washed by the blood of these latest martyrs, the first of this new age."

These holy martyrs invite us to live our Christian faith. They are an inspiration to us as we strive for holiness, and their witness of courage remind us to proclaim God's Good News by word and the witness of our lives.

READING I Acts 7:55-60

Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked up intently to heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, and Stephen said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." But they cried out in a loud voice, covered their ears, and rushed upon him together. They threw him out of the city, and began to stone him. The witnesses laid down their cloaks at the feet of a young man named Saul. As they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he fell to his knees and cried out in a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them;" and when he said this, he fell asleep.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth.

READING II Rev 22:12-14, 16-17, 20

I, John, heard a voice saying to me: "Behold, I am coming soon. I bring with me the recompense I will give to each according to his deeds. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." Blessed are they who wash their robes so as to have the right to the tree of life and enter the city through its gates. "I, Jesus, sent my angel to give you this testimony for the churches. I am the root and offspring of David, the bright morning star." The Spirit and the bride say, "Come." Let the hearer say, "Come." Let the one who thirsts come forward, and the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water. The one who gives this testimony says, "Yes, I am coming soon." Amen! Come, Lord Jesus!

GOSPEL In 14:23-29

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me. I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made.
