

Dear Parishioners.

I sure hope the remainder of 2023 does not go as quickly as the first month has gone. February is here whether we are ready or not. To bad it is not a leap year adding an extra day. I could use that this year so far. Nonetheless some things to look forward to this month. Next Saturday, February 11th is both the World Day of praying for the Sick and our Sweetheart Dance for all parishioners beginning at 6:30pm in the parish center great room.

February 11th is the World Day of the Sick due to it being the Feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes, the shrine in Lourdes, FRANCE where St. Bernadette Soubirous saw eighteen visions of Mary between February 11th and July 16th, 1858. On February 25th the Lady told Bernadette to drink the water of a spring that flowed under her rock. As there seemed to be no spring, Bernadette dug in the ground. Nothing happened, but a day or so afterwards the water started to flow. Bernadette drank it and washed in it and others did the same and the water acquired a reputation for healing properties. The spring is still flowing at the rate of 32,000 gallons a day, but analysis of the water has found nothing remarkable about it. On the feast of the Annunciation of the Virgin Mary on March 25th, the Lady at last proclaimed her identity. Speaking to Bernadette in the local Lourdes patois, she said 'I am the Immaculate Conception'. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception had been proclaimed only a few years before, in 1854. Bernadette saw her last apparition on July 16th, the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (History Today: Volume 58, Issue 2, February 2008). This is the shrine after which the Grotto at Notre Dame is modeled; constructed in 1896 a seventh the size of the grotto in Lourdes. It is also the shrine that the Grotto at Stonehill is modeled; dedicated in December of 1953. All three places are places of pilgrimage and prayer. Think about visiting the Grotto at Stonehill during Lent for some prayer and quiet reflection.

Our second collection during the month of February takes place at Masses the weekend of February 11th & 12th supporting the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. Catholic University is a national research university with over 5,700 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 250 academic programs in the heart of Washington, D.C. By giving to the collection, you are supporting future Catholic leaders, both religious and lay, who are being formed by an exceptional, faith-rooted education and the University's various research and training initiatives that support dioceses and parishes in responding to the most pressing needs of their faithful. The Catholic Project - an initiative that aims to heal the breach of trust many have experienced as a result of the crisis in the Church, a master's program in Ecclesial Administration and Management, and a credentialing program that prepares recent graduates to serve as campus ministers are a few examples how the University is serving the Church and nation. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting as well. Two smaller meals should not equal one regular meatless meal for the day. 



Preparation Process for Adult Confirmation

The diocesan preparation program for those adults (18+) seeking to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation is intended to provide catechetical instruction in the faith, as well as spiritual support to compliment the parish in the formation of candidates, who are completing their initiation in the Catholic Church.

Prior to registration, candidates must begin this process by meeting with the pastor to:

- Gather canonical documents
- Determine if there are any impediments to the reception of the Sacrament
- Ascertain desire and disposition of the inquirer requesting the Sacrament

At the conclusion of the preparation program, pastors should meet with the candidate to reflect on their experience and to verify the suitability of the sponsor before submitting the conferral form for the actual reception of the Sacrament.

This program consists of **seven sessions total**, with **both** virtual **and** in-person sessions. Attendance at all sessions is mandatory. Participants who miss two or more sessions may be asked by their pastor to postpone the reception of the Sacrament to the following semester, if the content which has been missed cannot be made up in some way.

Participants are asked to share their screens during virtual sessions.


