We are filled with joy to be able to welcome you back to church for the celebration of public Mass. Our parish plan has been prayerfully put together with the safety and health of all who gather to celebrate the sacraments that are essential to our spiritual lives. While we are able to reopen, there are many restrictions and limitations that we have to abide by that have been set by the Alameda County Health Officer and the Diocese of Oakland. Public Mass inside the Church is not permitted. Our three weekend masses will be outside.

Bishop Michael Barber has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses until further notice. Although this dispensation has been extended, all are encouraged to participate in prayer as Mass continues to be offered live stream. Those who are sick, not feeling well, and/or are at a higher risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus are encouraged to remain at home as an act of charity to all.

As we begin to resume public Mass, we ask for your continued prayers, understanding, patience, and cooperation as we celebrate the sacraments during this time of pandemic. We look forward to celebrating the Mass as One Body of Christ!
