While we journey through another shelter-in-place order, we are grateful we can continue to welcome you to church for the celebration of public Mass. Our parish plan has been prayerfully put together with the safety and health of all who gather to celebrate the sacraments that are essential to our spiritual lives. While we are able to continue in person worship, there are many restrictions and limitations that we have to abide by that have been set by the Alameda County Health Officer and the Diocese of Oakland. Public Mass inside the Church is not permitted. Our three weekend masses will be outside.

Bishop Michael Barber has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses until further notice. Although this dispensation has been extended, all are encouraged to participate in prayer as Mass continues to be offered live stream. Those who are sick, not feeling well, and/or are at a higher risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus are encouraged to remain at home as an act of charity to all.

As we begin to resume public Mass, we ask for your continued prayers, understanding, patience, and cooperation as we celebrate the sacraments during this time of pandemic. We look forward to celebrating the Mass as One Body of Christ!

A NEW DAY DAWNS

Today we hear how Jonah, sent by God to warn the people, storms through the streets of Nineveh, scaring the citizens out of their wits. And it works! God has a change of heart, seeing "by their actions" how the people turn from evil (Jonah 3:10). A new day dawns.

Next we hear Paul telling the Corinthians, "The world in its present form is passing away" (1 Corinthians 7:31). He calls for a change of heart. Stopping short of telling them to stop carrying out their everyday activities, he urges them—rather mysteriously—to live "as though" they aren't doing the things they are doing. A new day has dawned.

Finally, Jesus stands on the shore and cries, "The kingdom of God is at hand!" (Mark 1:14). Simon and Andrew abandon their nets—and even their father—and follow him. A new day had dawned.

Everyone has to change when a new day dawns: the Ninevites, the Corinthians, the apostles, even Jesus! Didn't a new day dawn today for us as well?






