

### From the desk of Fr. Ben



Dear Friends,

As we embark on our journey through the season of Lent, let us take a moment to reflect on its profound significance. Last Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of Lent, falls on March 5, 2025. Unlike Advent, which has been largely consumed by secular culture through commercialized Christmas sales and holiday music, Lent remains a sacred oasis untouched by consumerism. This absence of external

reminders invites us to fully engage in the Lenten season with intentionality and purpose.

Lent is a sacred time set aside for spiritual renewal, a season of preparation that calls us to ready our hearts for the most transformative event in human history: the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we are invited to deepen our faith, grow closer to God, and reflect on becoming the best versions of ourselves.

Last Ash Wednesday was one of the most well-attended liturgical celebrations of the year, showcasing how even those who may not regularly attend Mass make a special effort to receive ashes. This day marks the commencement of our 40-day Lenten journey, a period rich with self-denial and repentance. The ashes placed on our foreheads are reminders of our mortality—"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return"—but they also symbolize our sorrow for sin and our yearning for renewal.

#### The Temptations of Christ and Our Own Struggles

During his 40 days in the wilderness, Jesus faced three temptations from Satan, each a challenge to divert him from God's will:

- The first temptation was to turn stones into bread, symbolizing the temptation of physical comfort over spiritual sustenance.
- The second was the challenge to throw himself from the top of a temple, testing God's protection.
  - The third was an enticing offer of worldly power in exchange for worshipping Satan.

Each time, Jesus resisted, exhibiting steadfast faith. His journey serves as a powerful model for us as we confront our own daily struggles. Lent invites us to examine the challenges that pull us away from God and strengthen our resolve to live according to His will.

The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are more than a reminder of mortality; they are a call to repentance. We may not always resist temptation as Jesus did, but Lent offers us the opportunity to reflect, seek forgiveness, and initiate meaningful changes in our lives. Many choose to make sacrifices or embrace new spiritual practices during these 40 days, whether giving up certain luxuries, enhancing their prayer life, or dedicating time to acts of charity.

#### Community and Worship During Lent

This Lenten, we encourage your participation in our various programs and devotions, including Adoration and Confession from 5:00 to 5:45 PM and the traditional Stations of the Cross at 6:00 PM. These events provide a chance to deepen your Lenten experience and grow in faith alongside our community. Mark your calendars and join us as we journey through this sacred season together.

As St. Rose of Lima once said, "Apart from the cross, there is no other ladder by which we may go to heaven." May this Lenten season inspire us toward renewal, reflection, and a renewed commitment to our faith.



#### Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week



#### **Gospel Meditation**

#### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief, and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was "the greatest man in the world." Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says "no" in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity - body, soul and spirit - is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying "no" to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness.






