From the desk of Fr. Ben

Dear Friends,

Today, we embrace the Sixth Sunday of Easter, just before the Lord's Ascension, a poignant moment marking Jesus' final presence with His disciples. The gospel reading resonates with His tender farewell, beginning with a beautiful promise: "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word." This reflects the deep bond of a happily married couple, where every decision honors the other, fostering unity and joyful surprises.

Though Jesus will depart, His absence does not signal the end of His ministry or mission to bring us closer to God. His death and resurrection will be the pinnacle of His work. After His ascension, He will manifest a glorious yet invisible presence among us.

He assures us that we will not be left as orphans. The Holy Spirit will be sent as our Paraclete—our consoler, advocate, inspirer, and teacher—reminding us of all that Jesus taught. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we will continue the Master's work of sharing the good news of salvation with the world.

A priest noted that Jesus dedicated much time to teaching His disciples. They now carry the knowledge they need, and He does not abandon them—His love extends to all of us. He understands that the journey ahead may be long and challenging. With Him as our trusted friend, we can walk confidently toward our destination. He gives us His Spirit to remind us of His teachings.

In talking about the Holy Spirit, Jesus also speaks of peace. But what does peace truly mean? St. Augustine offers a profound definition: peace embodies "serenity of the mind, simplicity of heart, and tranquility of soul." Serenity of the mind emerges when we let go of exaggerated fears and avoid excessive worry.

Our worries can disturb our sleep and peace of mind. Simplicity of heart encourages us not to let our emotions spiral out of control. It calls for managing anger and envy, leading us to contentment. Thus, we must simplify our wants, desires, and needs.

Tranquility of soul arises when we address the spiritual chaos within us. Often, our lack of peace stems from unaddressed guilt and sin. Other theologians remind us that peace flourishes within a meaningful relationship with God, born from forgiveness, reconciliation, and unity. This enduring work of peace and love resonates powerfully today, continuing its legacy two thousand years in the making.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Jonathan Haidt's 2024 book entitled "The Anxious Generation" argues that today's kids are marked by significant increases in anxiety, as the title suggests. Smartphones, social media, economic uncertainty, the chaos of a global pandemic, fear regarding climate change, and the so-called "meaning crisis" all contribute to strikingly high levels of anxiety in young people today. I'm a bit older than this generation, but I feel it, too. The world can be too much to handle.

The Gospel this week offers a stunning solution for troubled souls. To his overwhelmed and anxious disciples, the risen Jesus says, "**Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you**" (John 14:27). His peace is that of the one who was overwhelmed on the cross and then conquered death by the power of his divinity, his bond of love with the Father. He offers us this unshakeable peace.

Of course, mental illness does not magically disappear because of the risen Jesus. But he does walk with us and offer us his peace in the midst of our suffering. The peace the world gives is not like his because it is weak, uncertain, and self-generated. Jesus' peace is strong, sure, and given as a gift from God. He gives it to us amid our anxiety. Will you receive it as a gift? I hope so. He wants to fill the hearts of this generation with his peace.



Shepherds Field Olive Wood Handcrafts Sale (Bethlehem & Jerusalem)

A group from the Holy Land (Bethlehem & Jerusalem) will be selling religious articles after **masses** to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. As a tradition, many of the Catholic families in the Holy Land work in small workshops to produce religious articles from olive wood. These articles represent the Christian art of the Holy Land. In the past, they used to sell their artwork to pilgrims who visit the Holy Land. **However, these days they are facing an economic hardship, as there are no pilgrims are visiting the Holy Land due to the political issues and the current war between the Israelis' and Hamas. Many of the Catholic families immigrated and left the Holy Land.** The percentage of Christians in the Holy Land has dropped from 20% to less than 1%. Therefore, if this hardship continues as it is now, we believe that in a few years, there will be no Catholics in Bethlehem or Jerusalem. The struggle to preserve the Catholic identity of the birthplace of our savior; Jesus Christ is a serious concern for Catholics around the world. Sales will be used to help and support the Catholics in the Holy Land and to encourage them not to immigrate."


