## *From the desk of Fr. Ben*

Dear Friends in Christ,

“Mary sits beside the Lord at His feet listening to Him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to Him and said: ‘Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving.’”

Today’s gospel introduces us to two women: Martha, the perfect host, and Mary, the perfect disciple. They are both eager to serve Jesus, but they go about it in different ways.

Martha is the perfect host. She prepares the house for Jesus and His disciples. She cooks the food and serves everyone because she thinks they are tired and hungry. She had no idea that Jesus came not to be served but to serve.

That is why Martha is so upset, so preoccupied with preparing nice food. She becomes high-blood and even snaps at Jesus for allowing Mary not to help her with the household chores. But Jesus gently rebuked her: “Martha, Martha, you fret and worry about so many things, but just one thing is needed; Mary has chosen the best portion.” That Mary listens to Him, learns from Him, experiences His presence, and occupies the place which only men should have, sitting at the foot of a master to learn and be taught.

On the other hand, Mary is the perfect disciple. She sits beside the Lord at His feet, listening to His instructions and teaching. She seems to know instinctively that “there is a need of only one thing,” (v. 42): to listen to the good news that He brings.

This might be the reason why God created us with two eyes and two ears but with only one tongue. He wants us to speak less but see and listen more, especially in our hearts. Just like what Fr. Jerry Orbos, SVD said in his book entitled *Simple Moments*: “Washing a car is pretty much the same as washing your heart. First, the car must be still so that it can be washed. The heart, too, must be *silent* so that it can *listen* (notice the same letters involved?). God cannot speak to a noisy heart. Second, the car, like the heart, must be obedient and submissive. God cannot speak to a heart that denies, rationalizes, or postpones. Third, the car, like the heart, must be open so that all the deepest corners and chambers can be reached and cleaned. In the same way, God cannot clean and heal a heart that is closed tight.”

It does not mean that Jesus did not appreciate Martha’s hospitality. But He chided her for being so anxious and upset about many things. She forgot a very important element in her relationship with Jesus. That is, to allow time to listen to a friend, a beloved, and most of all, to her Lord and Savior.

We can discern from the action and reaction of Martha and Mary in serving the Lord, as a form of spirituality. Martha, we have this active spirituality, and for Mary, we have the contemplative spirituality. It is a combination of prayer, action, or reflection that we need in our lives as Christians.

Action and contemplation are not viewed as in opposition but as complementary. As much as we are drawn to the danger of the much activity, we work and work as if there is no tomorrow. We are so involved in our apostolic activity, outreach program, and looking for money, but we miss giving attention to enlivening our relationship with God, family, and friends, and listening to them. If we have given so much time to work, we also need, in the same manner, a time for prayer, meditation, reading the Scripture, and the Eucharist.

All of us are a bit of Martha and Mary. We are both body and soul. We must keep both in balance. We must give each other due. Jesus does not need people who work for Him. He needs people who do His work.



### Gospel Meditation

#### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture


One of my close friends is a hermit priest who lives on a desert mountain. Recently I found myself in a group conversation about him. One vehemently objected, "What does he do up there all day? Nothing! Priests are down here working, running parishes, making a difference, and he... he is doing nothing! What a waste." The words dripped with indignation and resentment. Most of the group quietly nodded in silent agreement. Were they correct?

No! To see why, consider a similar scenario in this week's Gospel. Jesus visits his friends Martha and Mary. A hardworking and exasperated Martha complains to Jesus that her sister is attending to him rather than to urgent household tasks. Our Lord, rather than praising hospitality, explicitly celebrates the less-productive sister for doing the "one necessary thing." He praises her for she "has chosen the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary is busy doing what matters.

Before we freak out like Martha, consider that all work — domestic, manual, professional, ministerial, contemplative — is done to help us (sooner or later) to experience the love that makes us happy. We should be thankful for those who focus on the "better part" of radical, ceaseless prayer. They invite us to remember the purpose of all work is the enjoyment of love. Contemplatives, hermits, anyone fervently committed to prayer—they invite us to cast aside our forgetful, resentful, and self-aggrandizing attitudes in exchange for hearts ready to do what is finally necessary.






