
**Dear Friends in Christ,**

Dear Friends

As we observe the feast day dedicated to our church's patron saint, St. Anne, we have been diligently preparing for both the spiritual and celebratory aspects of this important occasion. I wish to express my gratitude to each individual involved, including our volunteers and the Festival Committees. I would like to extend special thanks to our chairperson, Jerry Willian, and co-chairs Anne and Jerico. Your contributions in various capacities are greatly valued and appreciated. Thank you for your commitment to this meaningful event.

Let's us reflect upon her life.

St. Anne is the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Though she is not mentioned by name in the Bible, we know of her through early Christian writings,



We are told that Anne, the wife of Joachim, was advanced in years before her prayers for a child were answered. An angel appeared and told her she would conceive a child who "shall be spoken of in all the world."

St. Anne's feast day is celebrated on July 26. She is known as the patron saint of mothers and women in labor, and minors.

The Lives of Saint Anne and Saint Joachim

The descendants of Adam grew in number, and the cries of the righteous for the Redeemer intensified. In this era of ancient laws, God sent two shining figures, Saint Joachim and Saint Anne, to herald the dawn of the Son of Justice.

Anne, dedicated to the temple at four, returned home at sixteen. One year later, as her mother lay dying, she was entrusted with the household and encouraged to marry, for she was destined to be a vessel of promise.

Saint Joachim lived in Nazareth, a just and holy man, deeply knowledgeable in the scriptures. His fervent prayers reached heaven as he sought God's fulfillment of promises.

Chaste Anne led a virtuous life from childhood, steeped in prayer and contemplation, always yearning for the Messiah. In a moment of divine coincidence, both Anne and Joachim prayed for spouses. It was God's will that they unite, and the angel Gabriel brought this message to them.

As Anne and Joachim married, they kept the angel's secret for many years. They began their life together humbly, honoring God by dividing their income among the temple, the poor, and themselves.

They endured taunts for their childlessness, yet patiently accepted their trials for twenty years, trusting in God's plan. This purification prepared them to welcome the Immaculate Conception, destined to be more pure than the brightest seraphim.

After Joachim was rejected at the temple for being childless, he withdrew to the mountains to pray. Meanwhile, Anne prayed fervently, and an angel reassured her that God had heard her. She was instructed to go to the Temple in Jerusalem the following morning...



## Worship & Meditation



### Gospel Meditation

#### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: **"Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you"** (Luke 11:9). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail.






