From the desk of Fr. Ben

Dear Friends in Christ,

Recently, someone in one of our ministry groups shared a YouTube video claiming to feature "Pope Leo XIV" and a so-called "new Church" filled with radical changes many have hoped for. The video seemed authentic—the voice was convincing, the language carefully crafted, and the visuals professionally done. But it was entirely false. There is no Pope Leo XIV. The entire production was a cleverly packaged piece of misinformation.

This incident is not isolated. We are surrounded by thousands of online videos, articles, and social media posts that *appear* trustworthy but are designed to mislead, confuse, or even undermine our faith. In today's digital world, especially with rapid advancements in artificial intelligence (AI), we must become more vigilant than ever in discerning truth from falsehood.

We are living in a time of remarkable technological progress. AI is transforming how we work, communicate, and interact with the world. As people of faith, we are not called to fear these changes, but to approach them with wisdom, moral clarity, and a discerning heart.



AI can be a powerful tool. It helps doctors diagnose illnesses, translates Scripture into different languages, and provides access to vast information instantly. It even holds potential for evangelization and reaching the marginalized.

But we must also be vigilant. AI systems, while powerful, are not morally neutral. They reflect the values of those who design and deploy them. They can spread misinformation, violate privacy, deepen inequality, or automate decisions in ways that neglect human dignity. There is also a risk that people may confuse machine intelligence with wisdom, or mistake convenience for truth.

We must remember: **machines do not have souls.** As Sr. Usselmann, the Director of Pauline media wisely said, "Human beings create, machines generate." AI cannot feel, reflect, or choose good over evil. It operates on patterns and data—nothing more. Human creativity, on the other hand, springs from our being made in the image and likeness of God. Our ability to reflect, imagine, and express beauty is a divine gift—something no machine can replicate.

So how do we guard ourselves as faith-filled people?

1. **Pause and Pray Before You Share** If you receive a video, article, or message that sounds sensational or too good (or bad) to be true—pause. Ask yourself: *Is this from a credible source? Would the Church actually say this?* When in doubt, seek guidance from official Church channels or ask a trusted spiritual leader.

2. **Educate Yourself and Others** Learn how AI and digital tools work. Help others—especially the elderly or young people—understand that not everything online is true. Teach your children to question what they see, even if it sounds spiritual.

3. **Verify Before You Believe** Always check sources. Does the Vatican website or a known Catholic news outlet support the claim? Be cautious of videos or posts that rely on emotional manipulation rather than verifiable facts.

4. **Stay Rooted in Scripture and Church Teaching** The more we are grounded in the Word of God and the teachings of the Church, the less likely we are to be misled. When our hearts are anchored in truth, lies become easier to spot.

Be a Witness to the Light Instead of spreading fear or confusion, be someone who shares messages of hope, clarity, and truth. Be known not for forwarding rumors, but for building up the Body of Christ with wisdom and love.

In a world full of artificial voices, may we listen for the voice of the Good Shepherd. Let us be discerning, courageous, and grounded in our faith as we navigate this new frontier—not with fear, but with the wisdom that comes from God.



Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

There was a young mother in my parish community who was depressed due to financial strain. She prayed for help. One morning before Mass, she placed on the counter a zip-lock bag filled with jewelry and old coins. Smiling, she explained she had been fixing an old cabinet and found the items hidden deep within the walls of her home. One particular coin could be worth as much as \$900,000. The contents of the bag-previously unknown to them-were now their prized possession. Their plans changed that week. They had to learn how much it was worth.

This week, the Lord tells us, **"For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Luke 12:34)**. Our lives revolve around what we treasure. When we discover the treasure the Father gives us-the kingdom of God-everything changes. We might not know its precise value, but we rearrange our lives around it. The joy of this discovery should never be far from our minds.

Sometimes we go through times when we can't find this treasure. It seems hidden. Or it appears like dirty old coins and worthless jewelry in a Ziploc bag. But how crazy would my parishioners be if they tossed it away without knowing the cash value? How much crazier are we if we center our hearts on any treasure except that of Jesus and his kingdom? Remember, the Father is pleased to give it to us. That's why we put our hearts there, even when it is hidden.


