## *From the desk of Fr. Ben*


Dear Friends,

This weekend, we have an opportunity to show our love and generosity to support the missionaries who bring the Good News to our brothers and sisters in every corner of the world. We are called to be part of this mission since we were baptized, so let us all be united in this great mission that God has entrusted to us all.

Below is the sharing of Fr. Anthony Loc Nguyen about his mission and The Congregation of the Mission in Vietnam. Welcome Fr. Anthony to our Parish of St. Anne.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, today we gather to celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Today we are invited to contemplate not just the wood of the cross, but the meaning of the cross in the life of Jesus, in the life of the Church, and in our own lives.

The first reading for today, from the Book of Numbers (21:4–9), tells us about the bronze serpent lifted up by Moses in the desert. When the Israelites sinned by complaining against God, serpents came among them and many were bitten. In response, God instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and lift it high on a pole. Whoever looked upon it with faith was healed and saved. This is a foreshadowing of the cross.



In the Gospel of John (3:13–17), Jesus Himself explains this mystery: *“Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life.”* The cross, then, is not an accident in God’s plan. It is not merely a tragic ending to a noble life. Rather, it is the very means by which salvation enters the world. God, in His infinite wisdom, chooses what is weak to shame the strong, chooses what seems foolish to confound the wise, chooses the cross to reveal the depth of His love.

**Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

As we gaze upon the cross today, let us see more than wood and nails. Let us see the love of God poured out for us. Let us see our own crosses transformed in His. Let us see the victory that comes through faith.

And let us live as people of the cross—willing to embrace sacrifice, willing to love to the end, willing to trust that no matter what darkness we face, the light of Christ will prevail.

So when we make the sign of the cross, let it not be a mere gesture. Let it be a confession of faith. Let it be our banner, our shield, our reminder that *“God so loved the world that He gave His only Son.”*

We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You, because by Your holy Cross You have redeemed the world.

Now, let me tell you a little bit about The Congregation of the Mission in Vietnam:

Currently, we have 130 priests, 12 Deacons, 200 seminarians in philosophy and theology, and 30 postulants. We are working in the rural areas in 15 dioceses in Vietnam. Because we live according to Vincentian spirituality, “following Jesus, who preached the Good News to the poor”, the parishes we serve are among the poorest in the dioceses. Those parishes are located in rural or remote areas of the dioceses. Our purpose is to reach out and accompany the poor.

As Vincentians, if we don't go, don't come, and don't work or don't care about the poor, we lose our roots. So, we have put a lot of effort into Vietnam to help the poor. We have been trying to build many houses for poor people, to help ethnic minorities in mountainous areas, and to help poor children have the opportunity to go to school. In addition, we help build water wells, toilets, and water containers, install purification systems, and provide seeds for agriculture, fertilizers, and pesticides for ethnic minorities.

In general, the ethnic people have to walk from 3 to 5 hours for Mass on Sunday. Then, after Mass, we give them something to eat, such as noodles, rice, beans, or whatever we have in the rectory.

Besides all this, we also need funds to train Vincentian seminarians. Thus, they will become priests or brothers of the Church and missionaries for the poor.

For our missionary work and seminarian formation to go well, we need your help.

Although we come from far away from Vietnam, we are in communion with the common mission of the whole Church. Therefore, we sincerely ask you to extend your kindness to help us financially. Thanks to your generosity, we will have more money for our seminarian training and mission work for the poor in Vietnam.

We also ask you to pray for our Vincentian province's training and missionary work in Vietnam.

Thank you for your generous cooperation on behalf of the poor and the Vincentians of Vietnam.

## Worship & Meditation



### Gospel Meditation

#### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy *What About Bob?* Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr. Marvin for breakthrough "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness - rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us.






