

Fr. Stan's Utterances



We now begin and enter the third week of Advent. The third, rose color candle is lit. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, "Gaudete Sunday" as it is called, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass. "Gaudete Sunday" is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when our preparation is now half over and we are closer to Christmas and Christ's Second Coming. Advent is a liturgical season, a period of time in which the Church surrounds us with reminders of the greatest event in the whole history of the universe: the incarnation of the Son of God, who came to earth to be our Savior. The Church gives us these reminders to help us get our souls ready to receive the special graces God wants to give us as we celebrate that event this year, in the "right now" of our lives. Those same reminders are also meant to spark a personal examination of conscience. If in that examination we notice any sinful or self-centered tendencies, habits, or activities, Advent is the time to get rid of them. That's how we get ready for our Lord's Second Coming.

John the Baptist is Christ's precursor, the one sent to announce His coming and get people ready to welcome Him. John the Baptist plays a central role in our Advent liturgy, because this is the season during which the Church recalls Jesus's first coming; readies itself to welcome Him at His new, spiritual coming this Christmas; and looks forward to His definitive, second

coming at the end of history. The word "Advent" actually originates from the Latin term for "coming towards." Jesus is "coming towards" us in a new way this Christmas, and the message of John the Baptist is meant to help us get ready. St. Luke emphasizes the incomparable importance of Christ's coming by pointing out how the Old Testament had prophesied not only the arrival of Jesus, but even the appearance of the precursor, John.

What should we do? That question is at the heart of it all. In today's Gospel, people came to John the Baptist with exactly that question. What should we do? Maybe we would expect a dramatic answer from John the Baptist. After all, he's a dramatic preacher and person who wears camel's hair and eats locusts with honey and preaches a tough message. However, his answer to the question "What should we do?" might surprise us. The answer is: share with others. Do your work well. It all seems so ordinary, but God takes the ordinary, and makes it extraordinary.

There's a striking verse in the first reading today, from the prophet Zephaniah. "The LORD, your God, is in your midst, a mighty savior; he will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, he will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals." Why does God say that about us? When God the Father



looks at us, He sees the image of His son, Jesus Christ. We are created in the "Imago Dei", the true image of God Himself. We are baptized Christians; we are transformed in Christ; we are children of God. In chapter five of the Second Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul puts it like this: "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come." Therefore, this is all true. Then, all our actions take on a new meaning. God looks on us with endless joy; and that means that our actions, however routine they may seem, if done out of love, are part of that joy. God takes the ordinary and makes it extraordinary.

Advent still has two weeks left. Let's make this our goal: to strive to know Jesus better at the end of these two weeks than we do today. I think we all know exactly how to make that happen, but the writing of Christmas cards, decorating the tree, buying Christmas presents, babysitting the grandchildren, visiting our friends, preparing for the Christmas parties are not allowing us the time for true spiritual growth during the holy Advent season. We need to spend more time with God in personal prayer every day. We need to read and reflect on His words and example as given to us in the Holy Scriptures.

Therefore; let us please slow down more. I know this is hard to do with all of the Christmas shopping, decorations and card writing; but God does say; slow down! Let us pray Holy Scripture each night, the rosary, the Angelus, etc. and let us pray as a family more and ask our family members to pray for us too. We are talking to each other, but are we really praying for one another? Advent is the time to do all of these important spiritual works. Let us listen to the voice of John the Baptist again as he said to all of us today, "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, 'Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?' John answered them, 'I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie.' This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing." How are we coming along with making an I-Pass Road for our souls for Jesus this Advent so far? How is the voice of the Baptist influencing us to listen and make room for God even more in our lives?

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages." Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." What does the Convalidation of a Marriage Mean?

A convalidation is when a couple married outside the Church seeks to have their union officially recognized by the Church. For various reasons, A Catholic party or parties find themselves in a civil marriage or in a marriage that took place before a non-Catholic minister. In time, some seek to have their marriages approved or "blessed" by the Catholic Church. A convalidation involves the willingness of both parties to enter into a sacramental marriage.

Does this describe your situation? Were you married in a civil service and are a baptized Catholic? Were you married in a civil service, divorced and remarried? Have you wondered if you can have your marriage blessed and recognized by the Church? If you answered yes, to any of these questions feel free to start a conversation to get some answers!

A convalidation does not mean you need to plan a big wedding ceremony with all the frills. Actually, it requires some paperwork, possible attendance to Pre Cana and a meaningful ceremony in church to crown your marriage with the sacrament. St. Gerald can offer you a private ceremony or to be included in a Sunday mass group ceremony!


