#### THE GOOSE AND THE BOULEVARD

Way back in the early nineteen sixties after having endured a long day at school I would race home to watch 'Garfield Goose' on WGN TV. Silly as it seems now I felt uniquely connected to Garfield Goose since at the time I was living on Garfield Boulevard. A mere block apart on the boulevard (which I just assumed was named for the royal goose) stood the venerable old Byrnes Building and an even more venerable and inspiring Visitation Church. Those twin pillars of my youth are warmly recalled whenever I listen to Dean Martin sing, "Memories are made of this." They are a gift to be cherished and a legacy to be handed down so that all that is good and true and lasting will not be forgotten in the frenzied pursuit of all that we are told is bigger and faster and more glamorous.

We need to cherish the lessons and fallen heroes of yesterday. We should celebrate the unique and fleeting gift that is today. It could be our last. We have to believe that even in the face of terrible suffering and cruelty tomorrow can be better because we can do better. And do better we must for the sake of the world's children. Ordinary people have been known to accomplish extraordinary things. They live right here in Oak Lawn. They are our mothers and fathers, husbands and wives, brother and sisters, sons and daughters, neighbors and friends who live lives of quiet dignity and strong faith. With every simple gesture of thoughtfulness and every kind word, though ridiculed by the mean spirited and cynical, ordinary folk do indeed make this world a little brighter and less angry.

As baptized Catholics and responsible citizens we extol the virtues of faith, hope and charity. We stand before God and with each other as equals who deserve to be respected and who, in turn, must never waver in our respect for all life. Acknowledging our common humanity and the dreams we all share is a first step in bridging the terrible gap between those who have so much and those who have little or nothing. The dreams of the poor and the neglected are no less important than those who have the means to achieve theirs.

Recently while watching the celebration of Queen Elizabeth's platinum jubilee I couldn't help but recall that Garfield Goose also lived in a castle and considered himself to be the King of the United States. Most Americans don't cotton to the experience and history. I can't even begin to imagine a Duke and Duchess of Canaryville, a Crown Prince of Burbank or even a Kingdom of Oak Lawn. The only title I have is the one to my car, although Sir Thomas Forbes does have a nice ring to it. Just kidding.

Unlike those earthly kingdoms that rise and fall there is an eternal kingdom where no one feels the sting of rejection simply because they are different or fail to measure up to the rigid demands of the self-righteous and self-important. In Chapter One of the Gospel of Mark after the arrest of John the Baptist, Jesus appeared in Galilee proclaiming to all who could hear: "This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Reform your lives and believe in the Good News." Words our

world needs to hear over and over again.

Watching the news coverage of the escalating violence in this country and the bitter political recrimination is heartbreaking and exhausting. It is not a stretch to wonder whether we will be safe when we go to school, church, the store or work. The Reign of God proclaimed by Jesus seems but a dream still unfulfilled. Too many turn a deaf ear to his invitation, "Reform your lives and believe in the Gospel." Too many turn a blind eye to those who see things differently. Too many remain silent because they are convinced that their voice will not be heard. There is just too much shouting and finger pointing and not nearly enough listening and reasoning and compassion.

For families mourning the loss of a child and nations torn apart by war the Kingdom of God must seem distant and far beyond our reach. For a helpless mother cradling a starving child in lands ravaged by poverty and for all victims of injustice and oppression the Reign of God must seem to be nothing more than another empty promise. And yet when we forgive and are forgiven the Reign of God draws near. When we sacrifice our needs for the truly needy the Reign of God draws near. When we speak truthfully and genuinely care for one another the Reign of God draws near. And when, at long last, we can embrace one another as brothers and sisters who are all precious and valued in God's eyes then the Reign of God will no longer be the kingdom to come. It will be here and that is the Good News Jesus proclaimed long ago and still does. He didn't give up. Neither can we. It is a lesson taught to me by my father. It is a lesson he learned in the South Pacific during World War II.

As we celebrate Fathers Day I am reminded of an old adage, "Great fathers don't find fault. Great fathers find solutions." It is a real blessing when a father and his child (no matter how old) celebrate triumphs big and small with pride and work through the hard times with trust and understanding. A loving father might then hear these words from grateful sons and daughters, "Dad, your guiding hand on my shoulder will remain with me forever.'

As we remember and honor all fathers, those living and those called home, let us also remember our Father in heaven who sees each of us as his beloved sons and daughters. Let us thank Father Robert and Father Stan for the faith they share and for all the priests who have served this great community of faith for alidea of kings and queens. Royalty and nobility are foreign to our most 90 years. In a special way let us remember Father Malcolm. In two weeks we will commemorate the 3<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of his sudden death. How time flies. As we face an unknown future and new realities I will close with one of Father Malcolm's favorite lines, "Don't sweat the small stuff." Happy Fathers Day!

#### Reading I

In those days, Melchizedek, king of Salem, brought out bread and wine, and being a priest of God Most High, he blessed Abram with these words: "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, the creator of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who delivered your foes into your hand." Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything.

#### Reading II

Brothers and sisters: I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes.

#### Gospel

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty." They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.


