


Easter Sunday The Resurrection Of The Lord



Jesus has truly risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Happy Easter to all of you and your families! Today we consider the mystery at the heart of the Christian faith. It is both extraordinary and powerful. It was so mind-blowing that even the disciples and the apostles Jesus told it would happen didn't believe it until they saw Him. It shattered all their concepts of life. In the whole history of humanity, death is the greatest fear. It is a punishment because of our sins as God has mentioned in the book of Genesis. Death was never part of God's plan. Now, death is conquered! Christ is risen! We can no longer live the same way now that death has been defeated in Christ.

In today's First Reading St. Peter reminds us that the Risen Christ only revealed Himself to those who believed in Him as mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 10, "They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us,



the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead." Only those who believed in Him were then blessed by meeting and eating and drinking with the Risen Lord. He reminds us that "everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name": on

the day of our Baptism we had an encounter with the Risen Lord that transformed us into children

pleasing to Our Heavenly Father, and He continues to reveal Himself to those who believe in Him. An encounter with the Risen Christ is always a salvific and transforming experience.

In today's Second Reading, St. Paul reminds us that an outlook of faith keeps our eyes fixed on the things of above. When we gaze above in faith, we know the Risen Christ stands at the right hand of His Father and intercedes for us. If we don't see Him, it is because our faith is not strong enough and we need to pray for stronger faith. The Resurrection banishes vanity from our lives and changes our perspective forever.

In today's Gospel, we see that the Resurrection didn't sink in for the Apostles until they witnessed the results themselves. It leaves us in hopeful suspense because death no longer had the last word. The Apostles had all the facts.



Christ did raise the dead. Martha saw his brother Lazarus raised after three days in the tomb. The mourners of the dead little girl's daughter mocked Jesus when He said she was sleeping, and then He "woke" her up.

Even Mary of Magdala first thought today that the body had been stolen. The disciples walking to Emmaus thought they had all the facts. Let us recall, after the Transfiguration, Jesus even told Peter, James and John not to tell anyone until He was raised from the dead and kept repeating that He would be raised from the dead on the third day.

The Apostles were still in confusion. We can't blame them. All the truthful teaching facts are at hand, but they lacked faith, and so they lived as if eternal life is somewhat like a fairy tale. We have many more signs that they did: the Church has testified to the Resurrection for over two thousand years, and many of her

children have gone to the grave believing that someday they would rise, just as Our Lord did. Like Peter and John, in today's Gospel, let's run and look at the physical signs of Jesus' resurrection—an empty tomb, a suspiciously well-folded head wrapping, and simply believe. "For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead (John 20:9)."

The Risen Lord didn't appear to those who tortured Him, imprisoned Him, or executed Him; Jesus appeared to those who believed in Him. The Risen Lord is the brightest light in our lives, if only we open our eyes in faith. Christ is not only risen. He is alive, right now! Forever! We spent Lent praying at the foot of the Cross; now, like Mary Magdalene, we can pray at His empty tomb. He will reveal himself, just as He did to Mary of Magdala, in His Second Coming, in His time, but we have to go on living always believing Jesus rose from the dead and ascended to the right hand of the Father. Happy Easter to all of you, your families and friends! God bless you all! Jesus is risen from the dead! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Dear Friends,

Christ is Risen! As we celebrate the greatest Truth of our Faith, namely, Christ's Resurrection, we are overwhelmed by the truth, that one day, if we are faithful to God, we too will be raised to eternal life by God. This day reminds us that anything is possible for God, and we give praise to Him for his salvation, goodness, love and mercy.

In the world so troubled by wars, violence, economic hardships, and immorality-be not afraid, take courage!

Remember, this is the day the Lord has made, rejoice and be glad! Cling to Jesus with all your heart and be faithful to him. He will make everything possible. Invest your time and energy in God, and God who sees in secret will repay you. Everytime Jesus called his disciples, he asked of them: "Come, follow Me." So as we refresh our faith and renew our baptismal promises this Easter, let us promise again that we will follow Him.

He will lead us to safety and peace. He will show us what it means to repent, to forgive and be forgiven. He will help to find purpose in life. He will show us the way!

Reading II

Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Gospel

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.


