THE JOURNEY AHEAD

October 12th1492, July 4th 1776, December 7th 1941, November 22nd 1963, July 20th 1969 and September 11th 2001 are dates in our American journey with which we are all familiar. We learned about them in history class. We watched the last one tragically unfold before our very eyes. We commemorate them with a solemn promise never to forget where we come from and, more importantly, always to remember who we should be on the journey that lies ahead. Our personal journey is also made unforgettable when we recall special moments and then smile to ourselves, **"That was a great day!"** On such days, if you are an aging sentimentalist like me, you will begin to understand these simple words so lovingly spoken to George Bailey by his guardian angel Clarence, "You see, George, you really had a wonderful life." What a great gift! One such day for me was August 1st 1969.

My younger brother John and I (God rest his soul) had a hard time sleeping after midnight on that August day almost 54 years ago. It was hot and humid and there was no air conditioning in our venerable apartment on the boulevard. We tossed and turned for hours in anticipation of what promised to be a journey to remember and a day not to be forgotten. As the sun rose on August 1st 1969 so too did we. After grabbing a delicious and nutritious chocolate donut from Korn's Bakery we walked to the corner of 55th and Halsted. There we anxiously awaited the CTA bus that would take us to a strange and distant land. We were going to the North Side of Chicago. It might as well have been the far side of the moon. Our destination was Wrigley Field. Friends and neighbors and denizens of old Comiskey Park thought us traitors to the South Side. I thought otherwise. We were intrepid explorers on a grand adventure not unlike Neil Armstrong who had just walked on the moon a few short days ago.

We reached Clark and Addison after what seemed like an eternity on a crowded bus of sweaty strangers and nervously exited our 'green chariot.' All we could utter was **"WOW!"** There it was: Wrigley Field in living color, the ivory covered walls, the iconic scoreboard, the greenest grass, the bluest sky, the best hot dog and larger than life ballplayers like Ernie Banks, Ron Santo and all the others. It **was** a great day. Being a good Catholic boy (from you know where) I couldn't help but think I was experiencing one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit promised at my confirmation. That, of course, would be wonder and awe. Wisdom is a work in progress when you are sixteen.

Looking back on that journey to Wrigley so long ago I now realize that it wasn't the destination that made the day special it was my brother who had journeyed with me. He was quite the character and I think it had something to do with the fact that he had the same birthday as Father Malcolm. Despite the inevitable challenges and heartaches we face, it is the people we journey with and meet along the way that make it all worthwhile and who remind us that even in the darkest of days we are not alone and never without hope. That is the glory of Easter and the empty tomb.

When I see others as the Risen Christ sees me and when I choose to be kind and merciful when it's easier to be indifferent or judgmental then *"I think to myself, what a wonderful world."*

On October 11th 1962 bishops from all over that wonderful world assembled in Rome for the Second Vatican Council. Over the next four years they would engage in wide ranging dialogue to better understand the relationship between the centuries old Catholic Church and the everchanging modern world. They came to appreciate that the Church was not just a beleaguered institution in a hostile world. It is "Lumen Gentium" - a Light to the Nations. It is "Gaudium et Spes"- Joy and Hope. It is the People of God on a shared journey of faith. We are all imperfect pilgrims on our way to the Kingdom of God. Henri Frederic Amiel was a19th century moral philosopher and poet. The words that follow are his reflections on the journey ahead. "Life is short and we never have enough time for gladdening the hearts of those who are travelling the journey with us. Oh, be swift to love, make haste to be kind!"

We who are blessed with loving families are called to love and journey with those do not. We who have friends to share our burdens and joys are called to welcome and journey with those who are friendless or belittled. We who live in peace and material comfort are called to journey with who those live with the threat of violence and who struggle just to survive. We who have heard the word of God and who share in his Body and Blood are called to hear the cry of the poor and to journey with all who seek justice and decency. We extend our hand to those who fall behind and grow weary. We don't wave them away because we are too busy and they don't meet certain rigid expectations. There may come a day when we might need a helping hand. Hands extended in friendship and welcome can make such a difference when we stumble. A kind word and a gentle smile can go a long way in mending a broken heart. As we journey through life with all its joys and sorrows let us hope, before it's too late, that when each day ends we can say to those who journey with us, "That was a great day." They all are.



Reading I

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, "What are we to do, my brothers?" Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is made to you and to your children and to all those far off, whomever the Lord our God will call." He testified with many other arguments, and was exhorting them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day.

Reading II

Beloved:

If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example that you should follow in his footsteps. *He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth.* When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel

Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."


