

Deacon Zach Jones' Ordination

On Sunday a group of us returned from Rome where we attended Zach Jones' ordination as a deacon. Deacon Zach will be ordained a priest in Sioux City in June of next year. There were two groups of folks who attended the ordination from here; a group of Zach's peers who participate in a young adult Bible study here at St. Joe's and a group of family and friends from Milford and beyond. I think that all involved in the visit to Rome and the Ordination would describe the entire experience as a pilgrimage. We visited dozens of churches and monuments in Rome and Assisi, where St. Francis lived and died. We visited the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel. We toured the excavations of the tomb of St. Peter beneath the Vatican Basilica. We visited ancient Roman buildings and we saw lots of beautiful art and architecture. We ate a lot of pasta and we walked and walked and walked ... (our cell phone "step tracker" told us that we averaged about eight miles a day on foot... with some days more than 10 miles.) We spent part of each day in prayer and went to Mass daily. We had a roof top terrace at the Convent where we stayed and we talked into the night about our faith, the history of the Church and analyzed the beautiful things we saw each day. The young among us rode electric scooters through ancient Rome and the "older" sat and sipped a glass of wine while the young lads sped by. Clearly the highlight of the trip was the beautiful ordination of a dozen young men as deacons for dioceses throughout the United States and three from




Technology Assistance
