Lenten Guidelines

Lent is a special time in the life of the Church and it is good to remind ourselves of the customs that all Catholics follow during the Lenten Season:

- ← Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both days of fast and abstinence. Adult Catholics are bound to take only one full meal and two small meals on both of these days. Further we are asked to avoid eating meat on those days we fast.
- ◆ Catholics are obliged to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. We fast and abstain during Lent to help us focus on the truth of the journey to heaven and to guide us to concentrate on the personal demands of "The Way, the Truth and the Life" that Jesus preached.
- ◆ All are encouraged to take up a personal act of penance during the Lenten season. We "give up" something during Lent to remind ourselves of the small disciples that Life in Christ demands.
- → All Catholics are reminded of the obligation to go to Confession once between Ash Wednesday and Pentecost Sunday (50 Days after Easter). Our Penance Services are tentatively set for Sun., March 27 2:30 p.m. at St. Mary's and 4 p.m. at Milford.We offer Confession each Saturday at 3:30 p.m. and Sunday mornings at 9:45 a.m.







eacon's Message

We are about to enter the season of Lent. Lent invites us to participate in that same preparation process of Jesus as He prepared for the start of his public ministry – going to the desert and listening to the voice of God. A good beginning is important to the whole journey, and not just through this one liturgical season into the next (Easter), but as a crucial recalibration of our essential baptismal identity around the mystery of Jesus.

Lent always begins with the temptation story, and this story is very important to us as we begin another Lenten journey. Just as the overture of a symphony introduces the many musical themes of the coming work, Matthew's temptation story signals the many themes that converge in his gospel to reveal who Jesus is.

From the very beginning, Lent is a reminder to us that to be baptized is to walk with Jesus. We take this time to review the temptations that are a part of our lives, that we might know ourselves more deeply and adjust our lives toward the will of God. Lent is a time to see how faithfully we are living out our baptismal call to holiness in the world, so we need to enter the desert to fast, pray and expose our souls to scrutiny.

The desert is both a place and a passage. The desert has many faces. A protracted illness may strip away our sense of self-sufficiency and quicken our appreciation of how short life really is, as I now know so well through the past several months in my own desert. A bout of insomnia can open us up to painful introspection and haul us into a "night court" of relentless self-questioning. Personal failure or loss may suddenly topple our assumptions about God, the meaning of life, the purpose of our existence. Crisis thrusts us into a time of selfexamination.

Lent can come at any moment, and the wilderness always waits at the edges of our often too-comfortable lives, ready to blur our certainties and challenge our sense of self-sufficiency. Lent invites us to surrender ourselves to the desert for a while, to let ourselves be tested, our commitment probed. We imagine that we are strong, ready to follow Jesus wherever He goes. But how will we know without being tested?

It is Lent. Jesus has gone out into the desert, and He is inviting us to follow Him.



Today's Gospel has encouraging words for good stewards--"Give and it shall be given to you. For the measure you measure with wll be measured back to you." What encouragement to give generously of the resources entrusted to our care!
