# Deacon's Message

Above all the grace and gifts that Christ gives to His beloved is that of overcoming self.

- St. Francis of Assisi

Soon after Pope Francis became our pope, he did something that made the world take notice, and gave us all a glimpse of why he chose Francis as his papal name He embraced and prayed with a man covered in tumors in St. Peter's Square.

The man reportedly suffers from neurofibromatosis, which according to the Mayo Clinic is a "genetic disorder that disturbs cell growth in your nervous system, causing tumors to form on nerve tissue." While it is not contagious, this courageous act of kindness proclaims Christ in a profound and moving

wav.

Part of St. Francis' conversion was when he discovered his ability to embrace a leper. Growing up, he was wealthy and enjoyed the comfortable life of a spoiled rich kid. He enjoyed things that were of high quality and beautiful. One day as he was riding his horse, he encountered a leper begging on the side of the road. At first he was repulsed by the horror of the disease. But he jumped off his horse, gave the leper all the money he had with him, and kissed the lepers hand. This experience was the turning point in his life.

Today, there are many people in the world that have been declared "ugly" or "undesirable". There may even be people at your school that have been forgotten or marginalized because they do not fit the

world's standard of beauty or cool.

Being a Catholic who loves Jesus challenges us to reject those false standards and give love to all. It demands we see others the way Jesus sees them and commands us to love one another as God has loved us.

St. Francis challenged his followers with these words: "The deeds you do today may be the only sermon people hear today." Pope Francis has shown us what those words mean. Let us pray that the way we love others today will proclaim how awesome Jesus is and be the next step on our path to sainthood.



Paul and Barnabas encountered both violent rejection and joyful acceptance of the message that they preached. We, too, may meet with mixed reactions when we use our gifts in the service of God. But, the Gospel assures us, the reward for those who follow faithfully is eternal life.
