Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Marriage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Pope Francís General Audience January 15, 2020 From the desk of... Bíshop James F. Checchío January 9, 2020



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we conclude our catechesis on the Acts of the Apostles with Paul's arrival in Rome, in chains, to appeal his case to Caesar. As we have seen, Saint Luke's account of the spread of the Gospel largely coincides with Paul's missionary journeys. In Rome, Paul is welcomed by the Christian community and permitted to remain under house arrest. Luke ends the Book of Acts not with Paul's martyrdom but by describing his tireless proclamation of the Gospel, showing the power of God's word which can never be chained (cf. 2 Tim 2:9). Paul's missionary journeys, culminating in this City, reveal the power of God's grace to open hearts to the Gospel and its saving message. Having in these past months followed the spread of the Good News throughout the world, let us ask the Holy Spirit to renew in each one of us the call to be courageous and joyful missionary disciples of Christ. In this way, we - in the footsteps of Paul - will fill our world with the Gospel and make our communities places of fraternity where all can encounter the risen Lord.



News from the Provost of the Raritan Congregation of the Oratory

I would like to take this opportunity to share some recent developments in our Oratorian community. As of January 15th, Fr. Ken Kolibas, Pastor of St. Joseph Church in Raritan, is on a four-month sabbatical. Please join us in praying for Fr. Ken that this would be a fruitful and spiritually renewing time for him. During the time of the sabbatical, the pastoral care of St. Joseph Church in Raritan will be provided by the members of the Raritan Congregation of the Oratory of St Philip Neri. Fr. Kevin Kelly, C.O. will continue at St. Joseph in his capacity as parochial vicar and will be the primary pastoral person serving the spiritual needs of the parish community. Fr. Jeffrey Calia, C.O., Pastor of Holy Trinity in Bradley Gardens, will serve as the financial administrator at St. Joseph while continuing his service as Pastor of Holy Trinity. Fr. Kevin and Fr. Jeff will be assisted by the other members or the Oratory.

In addition, as of January 27 the members of the Congregation will assume responsibility for the Blessed Sacrament Shrine in Raritan. I will take on the position of Rector of the Shrine while continuing as Head of School and member of the Faculty at St. Ann School.

Finally, Br. Fredy has scheduled his interview at the embassy in Bogota, Colombia for February 3. This is the final step in the visa process. We hope to have him home with us somewhere between February 10-15.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we take on these new ministries and pray fervently that the rest of Br. Fredy's visa process proceeds smoothly and quickly!
