



November 28th & 29th 1st Sunday of Advent

<u>December 5th & 6th:</u> There will be a special second collection in our parish at all the weekend Masses for Christmas Poinsettias. <u>December 8th:</u> The Immaculate Conception of The Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation in the Church. There will be a English Mass at 9am and a 7:00 pm Mass in Spanish. You are most welcome to join us at any of these celebrations.

Dear Parishioners, Greetings to you all from Fr. John Peter

Hope you are all doing well. We are entering into the most important season of the time. That is the beginning of the Season of Advent and the beginning of the New Liturgical Year. The Church year is distinctive. It always begins on the first Sunday of Advent, and with it comes a shift in the cycle of readings. Advent is the four-week liturgical season that precedes Christmas. The term "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus which means "coming," and it focuses not only on the past coming of Jesus on the first Christmas; but also, on the present coming of Jesus in the gospels, the sacraments, other people, prayer, love.

Advent is not Lent. In fact, the two seasons are extremely different. Advent stresses hope and joy, Lent stresses penance and sorrow; Advent emphasizes what we need to add into our lives such as joy, love and Light, while Lent emphasizes what we need to remove from our lives such as Sin. Advent lasts for four Sundays or 28 days, Lent lasts for six Sunday's or forty days. Advent is a liturgical season. Lent is an ascetical season with fasting, almsgiving, prayer, acts of charity. Advent stresses preparation with festivity. Lent stresses preparation with sackcloth and ashes.

I would like to speak about the **Second collection for Christmas flowers.** There will be a second collection for Christmas flowers on **December 5th & 6th.** This second collection is just for Christmas flowers alone and the money collected from it will be used to buy Poinsettias to decorate the Church for Christmas. I am sure that all of us would want the church to look beautiful for Christmas and so I would invite you all to be generous to this collection to make our church look pretty for Christmas. You can also give money to buy a Poinsettia in memory of your loved ones and we will publish the same in the bulletin. Please be generous.

I am sure that we will be getting busy during this season. Please make use of these opportunities to grow in our faith and to come closer to Christ. Please remember the Church in your generosity.

Estimados feligreses, Saludos a todos ustedes del P. Juan Pedro

Espero que estén todos bien. Estamos entrando en una temporada muy importante. Ese es el comienzo del tiempo de Adviento y el comienzo del nuevo año litúrgico. El año eclesiástico es distintivo. Siempre comienza el primer domingo de Adviento, y con él viene un cambio en el ciclo de lecturas. El Adviento es la temporada litúrgica de cuatro semanas que precede a la Navidad. El término "Adviento" se deriva de la palabra latina adventus que significa "venida" y se enfoca no solo en la pasada venida de Jesús en la primera Navidad; pero también, sobre la venida presente de Jesús en los evangelios, los sacramentos, otras personas, oración, amor.

El Adviento no es Cuaresma. De hecho, las dos estaciones son extremadamente diferentes. El Adviento enfatiza la esperanza y la alegría, la Cuaresma enfatiza la penitencia y el dolor; El Adviento enfatiza lo que necesitamos agregar a nuestras vidas, como gozo, amor y Luz, mientras que la Cuaresma enfatiza lo que necesitamos eliminar de nuestras vidas, como el pecado. El Adviento dura cuatro domingos, 28 días, la Cuaresma dura seis domingos, 40 días; El Adviento es un tiempo litúrgico, la Cuaresma es un tiempo ascético con ayuno, limosna, oración, actos de caridad. El Adviento enfatiza la preparación con la fiesta, la Cuaresma enfatiza la preparación con cilicio y cenizas.

Me gustaría hablar de la **Segunda colección para flores navideñas**. Habrá una segunda colección para flores navideñas el **5 y 6 de diciembre.** Esta segunda colección es solo para flores navideñas y el dinero recaudado se utilizará para comprar "Noches Buenas" para decorar la Iglesia para Navidad. Estoy seguro de que todos querremos que la iglesia se vea hermosa en Navidad y por eso los invito a todos a ser generosos con esta colección para que nuestra iglesia se vea bonita en Navidad. También puedes dar dinero para comprar una Noche Buena en memoria de tus seres queridos y lo publicaremos en el boletín. Por favor sea generoso.

THE ADVENT WREATH

The wreath is a circle, which has no beginning or end: God is eternal, and His love for us is everlasting. The wreath is made of fresh plant material, because Christ came to give us new, everlasting life through His passion, death and resurrection. Three candles are purple, symbolizing penance, preparation and sacrifice; the pink candle symbolizes the same but highlights the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, when we rejoice because our preparation is now half-way finished and Christ will soon come. The light represents Christ, who entered this world to scatter the darkness of evil and show us the way of righteousness. The progression of lighting candles shows our increasing readiness to meet Our Lord. Make the Advent wreath the centerpiece of the dinner table. Light it at dinner time, and say the special prayers along with grace before meals. This daily practice will help each member of the family keep focused on the
