Mass of the Healing Wednesday, November 3rd @ 6:30 p.m.: Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and let them pray over them, anointing them with the oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of the faithful will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise them up; and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven.

The Church receives the gift of healing power from the Lord as one of a list of charisms listed in the Letter of James. Anointing of the Sick is intended to bring about spiritual and even physical effects for those sick persons who approach in faith. Any person who is seriously ill, weakened by old age (even if no serious illness is present), or preparing for serious surgery due to illness may receive the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Each of us are in need of physical, spiritual, mental, emotional, psychological healing.

On November 3rd there won't be morning Mass but instead we will have the evening Mass in the Church so that many people can take part in the Sacrament of Healing. Come and get healed and anointed.

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings to you from Fr. John Peter. Hope you are all doing well. I pray for you all and most especially these days of my annual retreat. This week I want to write to you about the importance of two celebrations that we will have the opportunity to celebrate.

First is the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. This year the commemoration of All the Faithful Departed falls on Tuesday, November 2nd. We will have a Mass Celebrated in the Parish Church at 7pm, during which we will remember all the faithful departed, more particularly those who have gone before us for the year November 2020-October 2021. The month of November is a beautiful month of the year because the Church reminds us of three different church. The Triumphant Church that represents all those who are united with God in Heaven called Apostles Martyrs, Saints, Angels, etch who have been faithful and successful in their ministry and life here on earth and now united with God, praying for us all and being an example to imitate their life, journey and faith. We rejoice for them as we celebrate the Solemnity of All the Saints. Secondly, Militant Church that is we who are still continuing our battle in this world against the forces of evil, with our own struggles and challenges that we encounter here on earth on a daily basis and continue to make that choice to be faithful for God through the grace and power that comes to us from Christ. And lastly, the suffering Church that represents all those souls who are in Purgatory who are on their journey to Christ through their own purification. They are the ones who depend on us to support them through our prayers and sacrifices that they may pass from suffering Church to join the Triumphant Church. This is why we remember, on that particular day, the souls of all the faithful departed and remember to pray for them by way of Masses and other religious ways. As much as those who are in Purgatory need our prayers today and tomorrow, we will also be in need of others' prayers when we end up in Purgatory after our death. Hence, the need to support one another through prayers. I would encourage all of you to be present and to remember our loved ones and to pray for them in a special way on this particular day.

Saludos de parte del P. Juan Pedro. Espero que estén todos bien. Rezo por todos ustedes y muy especialmente en estos días de mi retiro anual. Esta semana quiero escribirles sobre la importancia de dos celebraciones que tendremos la oportunidad de celebrar.

Primero está la Conmemoración de todos los Fieles Difuntos. Este año la conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos cae el martes 2 de noviembre. Tendremos una Misa celebrada en la Iglesia Parroquial a las 19:00 horas, durante la cual recordaremos a todos los fieles difuntos, en particular a los que nos han precedido para el año noviembre 2020-octubre 2021. Nos regocijamos por ellos al celebrar la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos. En segundo lugar, la Iglesia militante, que somos nosotros, que aún continuamos nuestra batalla en este mundo contra las fuerzas del mal, con nuestras propias luchas y desafíos que encontramos aquí en la tierra a diario y continuamos tomando esa decisión de ser fieles a Dios a través de la gracia y el poder que nos viene de Cristo. Y por último, la Iglesia su friente que representa a todas aquellas almas que están en el Purgatorio y que están en camino hacia Cristo a través de su propia purificación. Ellos son los que dependen de nosotros para apoyarlos a través de nuestras oraciones y sacrificios para que puedan pasar de la Iglesia que sufre para unirse a la Iglesia Triunfante. La segunda es la Misa de Sanación el 3 de noviembre, miércoles a las 6:30 pm. Carta de Santiago nos dice: ¿Hay algún enfermo entre vosotros? Manden llamar a los sacerdotes de la Iglesia y oren por ellos, ungiéndolos con el aceite en el nombre del Señor; y la oración de los fieles salvará al enfermo, y el Señor lo resucitará; y si han cometido algún pecado, sus pecados serán perdonados. La Iglesia recibe el don del poder sanador del Señor como parte de una lista de carismas enumerados en la Carta de Santiago. La unción de los enfermos está destinada a producir efectos espirituales e incluso físicos para los enfermos que se acercan con fe. Cualquier persona que esté gravemente enferma, debilitada por la vejez (incluso si no hay una enfermedad grave) o que se esté preparando para una cirugía grave debido a una enfermedad puede recibir el sacramento de la unción de los enfermos. En este día no habrá Misa del mediodía, sino que tendremos la Misa vespertina en la Iglesia para que muchas personas puedan participar en el Sacramento de la Curación. Ven y cúrate.

Gracias por todo lo que hacen por la Iglesia.


