

How will you observe Holy Week this year?

- 1) Use a daily devotional to walk with Jesus through Jerusalem. Daily, spend time in scripture, soaking in the details of Jesus' final week on earth.
- 2) Attend a Maundy Thursday foot-washing service. Take time to wash each other's feet, explaining to your children that it's a way to serve each other. In 13:1-17, 31-35 together and then wash your children's feet.
- 3) Eat a Passover meal with your family and friends. The Last Supper was Jesus' last observance of Passover, so experiencing a Passover seder (dinner) is another way to step into the story of the Last Supper yourself.
- 4) Keep a prayer vigil on Thursday night After the Last Supper, Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. This was his most passionate and desperate night of prayer, yet the disciples he took with him kept falling asleep.
- 5) Pray the Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross (or Way of the Cross) is an ancient prayer that focuses on 14 moments (or stations) along Jesus' walk through Jerusalem. This prayer isn't only for Catholics. It's for anyone who wants to pick up their cross and walk with Jesus.
- 6) Fast on Good Friday. Take this as a day to fast in some way. It is the day Jesus died. It's the day of great sacrifice that Jesus made for us. Mourn the loss, imagine a "Good Friday world" without Jesus, and take time to repent of your own sins.
- 7) Observe the 3 hours on Good Friday when Jesus was on the cross. Jesus hung on the cross for three hours before he died. Historically, this is observed from noon to 3pm on Good Friday with a time of silence.
- 8) Share the Easter story with your kids (or grand-kids) Share the Easter story with others. Walk through Holy Week with them so they will fully understand why we celebrate on Easter Sunday.
- 9) Keep Saturday Solemn. Turn off electronics, limit activities, and imagine a day without Jesus. Experience the deep grief of the disciples who thought Jesus was gone forever and didn't yet understand the prophecy.
- 10) Rejoice on Easter Sunday. Rise early and watch the sunrise, the promise of a new day. Go to church as a family, celebrating in Christ's triumph over death.

Prayer of the Week

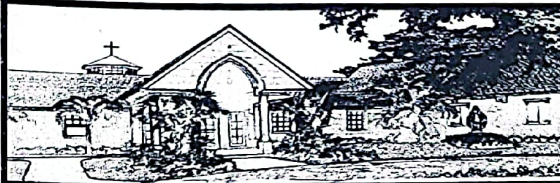

Reflecting on the Word

Abandonment and Salvation

Jesus came triumphantly into Jerusalem, but he knew what faced him. The death would be terrible, and the suffering that would accompany it would be searing. Worst of all would be the pain of abandonment. Jesus would die abandoned by everyone. His friends and disciples would run away and leave him alone.

From among his very best friends, one would turn him over to the authorities and another would deny knowing him. Jesus' experience of abandonment even seemed to extend to his Father: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

In dying his lonely death on the cross, Jesus brought salvation to all those who are abandoned by others: the poor, the homeless, the unemployed, the lonely elderly, those suffering from communicable diseases, the hungry, political prisoners, prostitutes, those on death row. Jesus died and rose that they might be liberated from their abandonment.

"Your attitude must be Christ's," we are told by St. Paul. We must empty ourselves and take the form of slaves on behalf of those who are abandoned by the world.

The ultimate injustice is for a person or group to be treated actively or abandoned passively as if they were nonmembers of the human race. To treat people this way is effectively to say that they simply do not count as human beings. - U.S. Bishops, *Economic Justice for All*, 1986: 77 - Gerald Darring
