Prayer for the Week

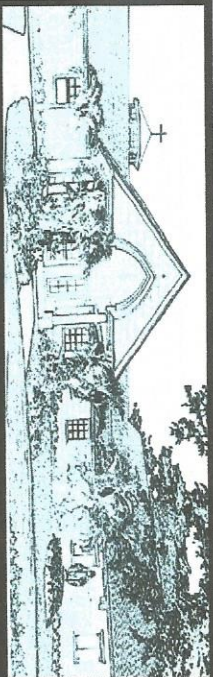

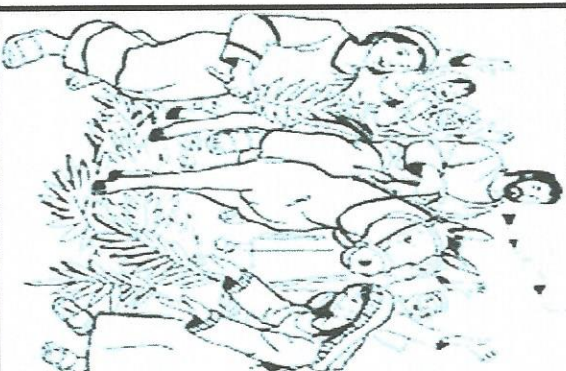
