## <u>Reflecting on the Word</u>

It is striking that in the story of the man born blind the man's neighbors enter into a debate—once he is healed—as to whether it is in fact the same man. It is as if they have difficulty recognizing him once the blindness that was for them his defining feature is gone. It is also noteworthy that they refer to him as "the one who used to sit and beg." For them, he was not a person with a name and a story, but simply a part of the landscape, wholly defined by his blindness and his begging. Furthermore, despite the fact that they know nothing about him, and seem to want to know nothing about him, they presume that his blindness must be the result of sin—either his sin or that of his parents.

Part of the irony of the story is that it is the man's neighbors who are really the blind ones. It is they who cannot see beyond their presumptions and prejudices and truly perceive the blind man. Moreover, they cannot truly see Jesus, saying that they know that he is a sinner. As Jesus heals the man's physical blindness, he is also trying to heal the blindness of the bystanders by giving them the eyes of faith, so they can see what the blind man now sees: that if Jesus were not from God he would not be able to do anything.

Though we might think of healing physical blindness as a great miracle, the Gospel of John seems to be saying that it is spiritual blindness that truly needs to be overcome, and it is the healing of the spir-

itual blindness that is the greatest miracle. ~ *Living the Word~*
