Our Catholic Church dedicates the month of May to Our Blessed Mother. Among her many titles is Mary, Queen of Peace. Like her Son Jesus, Mary deeply desires peace for our world. 'Peace' has been a theme of her messages for centuries as she appears in countries around the world. In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. On April 20th, over 150 people gathered at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church at a diocesan Interfaith Prayer Service for Peace, Nonviolence and Remembrance of Crime Victims. Those present joined with eight different faith leaders who offered prayers from their various traditions. All took the pledge for peace below. You are invited today to join them and people around the United States and beyond to make this pledge in your own life.

I wholeheartedly pledge to take a stand against violence and to help build a culture of active nonviolence. I will strive to:

Practice nonviolence toward myself. Practice nonviolence toward all others. Practice nonviolence by joining the global movement to abolish war, end poverty, stop the destruction of the earth and foster a just and peaceful world for all. As we begin this month of May, we ask Mary, Queen of Peace, to intercede for us for peace in our world on behalf of her Son. Fr. Frans van der Lugt, S. J.

Two years ago Gr. Van der Lugt was forced from his home in Syria and killed. He was murdered for doing what you would want to do yourself. He was killed for little more than his faithful presence among the persecuted people and his humble prayers for a real peace.

His senseless death is made meaningful in his witness to love in a place of death. He freely chose to stay to be with others who were suffering. He made love real in an otherwise God-forsaken circumstance. We have just celebrated the passion and death of Christ. It has been a holy and sacred time. His time has been holy because we witness again the crucifixion of the innocent, the cruelty of the fearful, the sorrow of the persecuted and the consequence of our complicity. This time is holy because we witness again the promises of love, the rites of community growing and new life rising. We celebrate a love that is stronger than death. We imagine the life of Frans. Why did he stay in Syria? What can one old man do? He can pray, he can learn the language, he can be there with the suffering and more. He can be remembered and he can inspire others. 
