While our first reaction is to lash out with the same degree of hostility, we hear the words of the Lord, calling us to repay even hatred with love.

We cannot become the evil that we detest. The call within our nation to consider as suspect entire populations of citizens, immigrants or visitors is contrary to what is best in the American people. We cannot relive the prejudices of the past, nor conjure up new ones in this century. Violence will only beget more violence. The cycle must be broken. We join with all who are committed to the common good, rooted in the values of justice, love, peace and tolerance, as we pray for those who lost their lives or their loved ones and who live now in fear because of acts of violence. #### The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our Diocese of San Jose annually provides every parish an opportunity to participate in the Mission Co-Op Plan. The plan is twofold. Firstly, it educates the people of God to the missionary work of the Church, and secondly, it provides financial assistance to mission-sending societies and mission dioceses. This year, we are assigned the Archdiocese of Juba, Sudan. Below is some information.

The political situation in our young country, South Sudan, remains chaotic and maddeningly murderous. Most of our people are displaced and rendered helpless having lost everything. The church remains the only hope for our war exhausted desperate people, because it's the viable social institution still intact and working. Our clergy and evangelical agents are working tirelessly to keep the flames of faith burning brightly in the hearts or our dejected people despite the engulfing violence.

- 1. Our Clergy, Religious and Lay Evangelical Agents are Evangelizing and Ministering vigorously proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our people. We are gathering people into the Church, catechizing them and forming and consolidating faith.
- 2. Our Archdiocese of Juba serves over 1 million people of which about 800,000 are Catholic. We run 15 parishes, 287 chapels and Prayers Centers with large territories. We have 54 active priests to be cared and provided for. We have over 600 catechists ministering in the village chapels and Prayers Centers to be trained and supported. Indeed, over half or our catechists are not trained. We have 40 Major and 65 Minor Seminarians under formation to be cared and provided for. Our clergy and other Evangelical Agents need ongoing education to keep them up to date in the ministry.
- 3. We are involved in formal and informal education. We are running 15 Grade Schools, 3 High Schools, and 2 Professional Technical Training Schools, with 7,587; 3,230; and 593 students respectively, a little drop in the oceans of ignorance and illiteracy. We have millions of eligible school-age children who are not enrolled in school due to lack schools and teachers. We have 187 teachers, most are untrained. We are running ongoing faith formation for adults and adult education for women in particular. General illiteracy rate in our country is 87% for men and nearly 95% for women. Ignorance is, indeed, killing us.
- 4. We are ministering to the sick in our few health-centers. We are burying the dead, sheltering, feeding, healing, and consoling the survivors amid the ongoing carnage.
- 5. We are also struggling to assist our people to feed their families by promoting Agricultural productivity.

We look forward to welcoming Father Philip Pitya who will preach at all masses of the weekend of July 23/24, 2016. Please be advised that the envelopes for the collection of this year's Mission Cooperative Plan are available in the vestibules. Thank you so much for your generous support.

#### Get On The Bus Founder

In 2000, Sister Suzanne Jabro, C.S.J., a Los Angeles nun, discovered a hard fact when working with prisoners: "Nobody visits women in prison" says Jabro with her characteristic no-nonsense manner. Their men have left and the children live with relatives who can't drive, can't afford the gas or can't manager a carful of kids."

As part of her job in the Office of Restorative Justice for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Jabro, with other members of an interfaith delegation, visited Chowchilla to find out how to help female inmates. "Oh, we had all kinds of ideas, but when we asked them what they wanted they said, "To see my kids." Some of them hadn't seen their children for four to nine years.

Jabro knew in her heart that reuniting these broken families could have intense emotional benefits. A study has determined that inmates who have contact with their families are less likely to be rearrested once they are released. The Get On The Bus program began in 2000 with one bus, one prison and 17 children. By 2013 it has grown to 47 buses and 1170 children and keeps growing every year. One mother who hadn't seen her daughter in nine years was so motivated that when she was released she gave 10% from her minimal pay job to Get On The Bus The Bus.


