Social Justice Corner

For almost 50 years, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated *National Migration Week* (January 8th-14th) as an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants-immigrants, refuges, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. Pope Francis calls us to encounter migrants as children of God, and not being aloof or suspicious of their intentions. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops offers these prayers:

Merciful and Loving Father, Open our hearts to provide hospitality and refuge to migrants who are lonely, afraid and far from their homes. Give us the courage to welcome every stranger as Christ in our midst, to invite them into our communities as a demonstration of Christ's love for us. Help us to see in her the face of your Son, when we meet a stranger, that we take his hand in welcome. Help us to live in solidarity-to seek justice for those who are persecuted and comfort for those who are suffering. We pray for Pope Francis, for bishops, priests and laity that we may boldly proclaim Christ's teaching on human dignity. For unaccompanied migrant children, that God protect them on their journey and safely reunite them with their families. For migrant workers, that they may labor in safe and just conditions, and that we who benefit from their labor may be truly grateful for what they provide. For our President, governmental leaders and policy makers, that they will provide the support to migrant populations who yearn for a new beginning. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

St. Elizabeth Seton

Elizabeth Seton was a married woman who, after raising her family, formed the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph. We honor the family this month, as, traditionally, the Sunday between Christmas and New Year's is Holy Family Sunday. In Elizabeth Seton we have the model of a mother, wife and avowed sister. She was actually a convert to Catholicism which happened when she journeyed to Italy for her husband's health. Her family was not happy with her choice of religion, but she maintained her conversion and even made peace with her family. Elizabeth and her congregation of sisters ministered to children with schools and orphanages. By the time of her death in 1821, there were 20 schools and orphanages that she instituted. Quote: "God is with us — and if sufferings abound in us, his Consolations also greatly abound and far exceed all utterance."


A Prayer for our Church
