Social Justice Corner

On this Sunday in Lent, we are reminded of death through the story of the raising of Lazarus. It is the fifth Sunday of Lent and also the Sunday when our catechumens hear Christ proclaimed as Savior. He is the one who conquers sin and death. Jesus says to Martha: "I am the resurrection." All of us are called to believe in him, and in the Resurrection.

The challenge here could not be more personal. We all tend to avoid death. We resist thinking about it. Yet there are times when we are forced to confront it. A loved one dies or is ill. In these circumstances, Jesus asks us "Do you believe?" Is there an afterlife?

The raising of Lazarus is a powerful story. To hear it and to proclaim it in faith is hard. But through it, light breaks.

Fifth Sunday of Lent (Third Scrutiny)

Dear Parishioners, Families and Friends,

Today is the fifth Sunday of Lent. The First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel starts: "Thus says the Lord God... I will put my spirit in you that you may live..." (cf. chapter 37: 12-14). It is God who creates us in God's image, so that by the Spirit of God we are spiritual by being gracious in response to God's gifts of faith and community.

Through Baptism, we celebrate our Christian faith by participating in the Sunday Eucharist and daily service. We have formed together a community of faith, so that we continue to welcome and embrace each other on the journey of life. When pharmacist Mary Neveu left San Jose in 1963, her plan was to help the fledgling mission and medical clinic of the Tarahumara Indians in Mexico for 6 months. She stayed for 36 years. Mary was a hard worker. She worked in the pharmacy and also in the local parish, side by side with the pastor, Fr. Luis Verplancken. She handled all the paperwork, accounting, and pharmacy. She helped the local poor people and often stayed up til midnight.

Queen of Apostles parish heard of her sacrifice and for many years, helped her with donations to the clinic. With our help, the clinic turned into a hospital for the local people. Mary died when she was well into her 80s, doing the work she loved, with the people she came to love.

What an example of giving and caring she was to us. How dedicated to stay there her whole adult life, giving to people who needed her most. We remember her and her sacrifice.


