This Thursday, our Church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord. Jesus commissions his disciples: "Make disciples of all nations, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matt 28:19-20

Jesus commissions us, also. Sixth Sunday of Easter

In all of our lives, we have advocates. The ones who will speak on our behalf or provide support or guidance when we are unable to move forward alone. In today's gospel, Jesus is speaking to his disciples during the Last Supper and is relaying this message of advocacy to them. While He may be leaving to be one with the Father, those who love Him, believe in Him, and follow His commandments will not be left alone. An advocate, in the form of the Holy Spirit, will be sent to them and to all who accept and follow the Commandments.

Ask yourself, "How many times though, have I tried to go alone in a task, without seeking the assistance or advocate that I might need only to find that I could only go so far on my own?" This is something that we can all relate to; the need or desire to be fully independent. 
