

THE CROSS IS THE KEY TO LOVE

Today is Palm Sunday and in these upcoming Holy Days, we will listen to the greatest love story ever told. From the very beginning of time, God fell in love with us. Love was made tangible when God sent his beloved Son to become human, to heal, touch, listen, teach, and forgive. Ultimately His Son, ever obedient, died on the cross, once and for all, for the sins of mankind.

When Fr. Christopher Bennett, pastor of St. Christopher Parish, was a little boy, his grandmother always reminded the grandchildren, "Wherever we go, we should always carry a cross in our pocket. *The cross is the key to love*," she would say, "and every time you put your hand in your pocket and touch the cross, remember the love that God has for you." Fr. Chris still carries a cross in his pocket today. He says, "In these uncharted waters we are facing, we need more than ever to hold onto that cross."

When Jesus was dying on the cross, the thief beside him begged, "Jesus, remember me!" Jesus promised, "Today you will be with me in paradise!" Let you and I not be afraid to plea, "Jesus, remember me – in my fears, my pain and suffering, in these uncharted waters." Jesus came into this world to pick up the pieces of our broken lives, to heal us, to draw us as one with His Father. We can never, ever walk away from the cross. The cross opens the door for Christ to come in. *The cross is the key to love*.

Instead of looking DOWN at our sufferings and sinfulness, look UP to God. Look UP at each consecration when the host is lifted high before us. "Behold the Lamb of God." Jesus said, "Remember me." "Those who believe in me will have everlasting life."
