Annual Catholic Appeal

The Annual Catholic Appeal is well underway. Our goals are:

St. Mary's has received \$11,798 in pledges, which is 52% of their goal. 43 families have participated (26%). Family Faith Formation:
By Heart Catechism

Selected questions from the *By Heart Catechism*:

104. **What does the Church teach about the Resurrection?** The Catholic Church teaches that Jesus was raised bodily from the dead by the power of the Fa-

ative in Reconciliation. **Please the Sacrament of Mercy** more info or to register, call Lydia Sproull at (509) 258-9388. On this occasion of Divine Mercy Sunday, we consider the Sacrament of Reconciliation (the "Sacrament of Mercy"). The confessional is a mercy chapel, and going to confession is like a pilgrimage to mercy where we encounter the love and mercy of the risen Lord in a privileged and intimate way. Whether one makes the monthly pilgrimage to the confessional or whether one has not been to confession in many years, the Lord is always there for us, always ready to give us the grace of His love and mercy in the forgiveness of all of our sins. As the Lord said to St. Maria Faustina in a private revelation: "As often as you ask for it, you glorify My mercy."

So, what do we do? How do we go about going to confession? First, even before entering the confessional, we pray and reflect upon what we have done and what we have failed to do: the Examination of Conscience. Next, we enter the confessional, and confess to the priest either face-to-face or anonymously behind the screen. Then, we begin our confession with a Sign of the Cross and say: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been [number of days, weeks, months, years] since my last confession, and these are my sins." We then confess our sins (what we have done and what we have failed to do). What sin and how many times: that is the only information that the priest generally needs to know; if he needs to know more for clarification, he will ask.

After you confess your sins, the priest may have some brief remarks to help encourage you on the path to virtue and holiness of life, and he will assign a penance. He will then ask you to say an Act of Contrition (our confessionals have an Act of Contrition printed and available in case you do not have it memorized). The priest then prays the Prayer of Absolution, and the priest must say these words: "And I absolve you from your sins, in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Confession is then over.

Many folks fear the confessional, but as Pope Francis reminds us, the confessional is not a torture chamber. It is helpful, rather, to think of the confessional as a doctor's office and the priest is as a doctor: he is there to help you, to
