The House of God

In Matthew 21, there is the Gospel episode of Jesus clearing out the temple area, for the people had not been treating the temple as it should have been treated: as the house of God.

In recent weeks, I have been receiving more and more complaints from parishioners that it is getting increasingly difficult and frustrating trying to pray in the church before, during, and after Mass. The reason for this is the amount of chatter and idle conversation in the church before and after Mass and the very distracting annoyance of cell phones ringing during Mass. I have personally observed this growing trend and thus concur with these complaints.

The church is the house of God. The church, therefore, demands reverence and respect; at the very least, those folks trying to pray in the church desire peace and quiet so that *they* can observe reverence and respect. Before, during, and after Mass in the church is a time for prayer, reflection, and worship; it is *not* for cell phone conversations, texting, sharing jokes, telling stories about fishing or hunting, spreading gossip, and so forth.

Regarding cell phones, it really should not have to be said, but . . . please silence your cell phones before entering the church. Or better yet, leave them in your car. There is nothing more distracting that the priest at Mass about to turn bread into God . . . and someone's cell phone starts ringing! There is no need for anyone to have a cell phone in the church except for the two doctors who are parishioners and therefore who might be on call; other than them, nobody needs their cell phone in church, and certainly nobody needs them on.

Regarding conversations in the church before and after Mass: take it outside. Take it to the parish hall. Save it for another time. People are trying to pray in the church. If you will not respect the church as the house of God, you can at least respect your fellow parishioners by avoiding chatter and idle conversations and other noises before, during, and after Mass.

Most of the time, most of you are very good about all of this. But it only takes one: one bad apple to ruin the whole barrel; one booger to ruin the punch bowl; one cell phone ringing or chatter to ruin the reverence and respect for the house of God.

If you see or hear your fellow parishioners causing such distractions, then please engage in a bit of fraternal charity and ask them to stop. And if you yourself are the cause of such distractions and your fellow parishioner asks *you* to stop, then please have the humility to stop.

Thank you for your kind compliance with this urgent request. Together, we can make our parish church the house of God that we know it can be — the house of God that God intends.
