290. What does the thought of the duties and obligations that flow from the love of God and neighbor help the Christian to do? It helps the Christian to: form a right conscience; always choose what is right; avoid sin and the near occasions of sin; live in this world according to the Holy Spirit for the love of God.

Mass Intentions

Each week in the parish bulletin, we find Mass intentions for the weekday Masses and the 4:00 PM vigil Mass on Saturdays. What are Mass intentions? What do they do and what are they all about? How can we request Mass intentions?

Keep in mind that the Mass basically is one long prayer (comprised, of course, of several smaller prayers that are all connected in the Eucharistic celebration). And so, as with any prayer, the Mass can be offered for a specific intention. Just as people ask us to pray for them, and we might do so by praying a Rosary for them, so we can have the prayer of the Mass offered for them.

Mass intentions can be for specific people, living or deceased. In our bulletin, we indicate that a Mass is being offered for someone who is deceased by including a cross ("+") after their name in the bulletin. Without that little cross, the name listed for a given Mass intention is a living person.

Sometimes two or more names are listed for the same Mass intention: a married couple on the occasion of their anniversary; parishioners who worked together to organize a parish event. Mass intentions can also be for a particular cause. "Peace in our world." Or, "vocations to the priesthood and religious life."

In our parishes, the Mass intentions for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday are open for anyone to request a Mass intention. Saturday 4 PM Mass intentions have been reserved for Fr. Jeff, who offers those Masses for deceased priests in our diocese, deceased family or friends, and most frequently deceased members of our parishes during his tenure here as our pastor. The three remaining weekend Masses: 6 PM in Springdale Mass intentions are always for Sacred Heart parishioners; 8 AM in Valley or at Jump Off Joe are always for our parishioners of Holy Ghost/St. Joseph; 10 AM in Chewelah are always for St. Mary of the Rosary parishioners.

To request a Mass intention, simply call the parish office and Brenda will help you find a Mass time for your intention. We are often filled up two and sometimes even three months in advance, so if you have a specific date in mind for a Mass intention, let us know as soon as you can!

One of the Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy is praying for the living and the dead. Having a Mass offered for someone is the best prayer that can be prayed to fulfill that Spiritual Work of Mercy because the Mass is the most perfect form of prayer. Everyone is encouraged, therefore, to take every advantage of this opportunity to have Masses offered for your intentions on behalf of somebody whom you love, living or deceased.
