

Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday will be done differently this year. Father will bless the ashes with holy water and then address those present only once with either "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." He will then cleanse his hands, put on his mask and distribute the ashes to those who come forward. Instead of making the sign of the cross on a person's forehead, he will sprinkle them over the top of the head. This is a common practice in Italy and other countries.
