

## Fr. Mike's Corner for August 8th.

Did you hear our second reading from Ephesians? St. Paul says to imitate Our Lord. Put away all rivalries, malice, fury and the like and forgive each other as Christ forgives us. As Catholics we are members of the Roman Catholic Church first. If we see ourselves as members of our parish first we must re-evaluate. Our membership in the Body of Christ the Church makes us members of our parish, not the other way around. We are a members of the Diocese next as part of the Body of Christ the

Church because unity with our bishop isn't optional. Parish membership is obtained after this.

Remember that being a Christian of any sort demands we die to ourselves and our sinfulness and live to please Jesus Christ. One of the biggest helps in this is the grace received in confession. It is said a soul that is dead in mortal sin is resurrected back into eternal life through the Sacrament. Don't put off receiving this grace! If God is a priority when you live, God will be a priority as you die. If God isn't priority as you live, he won't be as you pass on to eternity.



### Saint of the Week - St. Dominic

Things were bad. God's house was in ruins. The English and the French were busy fighting each other rather than dealing with the threat of Islam that had already taken Spain and could threaten to take England and



France. And who was helping the Spanish who had been fighting the Muslims since the early 700's? No one really. Church offices were being bought and sold and a host of other things.

God had a solution. Dominic De Guzman was part of it. He lived from 1170 to 1221 and was a contemporary St Francis (1181-1226). Dominic's mother had a dream that a dog leapt from her womb and set the world on fire. This foretold the fact that St Dominic would found the order of preachers (The Dominicans) who were renowned for their preaching. The name Dominican's sounds like the Latin Domini Canines or the Lord's Dogs. The Dominicans reignited the fire of faith in Europe and helped St Francis's Franciscans bring Europe back to the faith. (I hope this makes obvious the meaning of the dream!)

Both Dominic and Francis were from wealthy families yet both gave up that wealth to gain the everlasting wealth of heaven. Was the road hard? Yes, it was. It wasn't just the surrender of earthly resources but the dying to oneself and giving up the bad habits so many of us cling to.
